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8 SYNOPSIS: Currently, under Chapter 12, Title 40, Code  
9 of Alabama 1975, the Department of Revenue is  
10 authorized to promulgate rules relating to the  
11 issuing of business and other licenses by the  
12 department.

13 This bill would require that each applicant  
14 for a new or renewal license under Chapter 12 to  
15 provide his or her federal employer identification  
16 number or Social Security number.

18 A BILL  
19 TO BE ENTITLED  
20 AN ACT  
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22 To amend Section 40-12-30, Code of Alabama 1975,  
23 relating to the Department of Revenue rule-making power  
24 regarding licenses issued by the department; to require an  
25 applicant to submit his or her federal tax identification  
26 number or Social Security number.

27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1           Section 1. Section 40-12-30, Code of Alabama 1975,  
2 is amended to read as follows:

3           "§40-12-30.

4           "(a) The Department of Revenue is hereby authorized  
5 to promulgate reasonable rules and regulations relating to the  
6 administration and enforcement of the provisions of this act  
7 and those other provisions of this chapter relating to the  
8 licensing of automobile and other motor vehicle dealers not in  
9 conflict with the specific provisions hereof.

10           "(b) Every applicant for a new license and renewal  
11 issued pursuant to Articles 2, 6, 8, and 9 of Chapter 12 of  
12 Title 40 shall provide to the issuing agent the applicant's  
13 federal employer identification number or, if the applicant is  
14 a sole proprietorship and does not possess same, the  
15 applicant's Social Security number. The federal employer  
16 identification number or Social Security number shall be  
17 included with the license information reported to the  
18 department by each county.

19           "(c) All business privilege license application  
20 information for new licenses and renewals shall be transmitted  
21 electronically to the department by the probate judge or other  
22 county licensing official in a manner as prescribed by the  
23 department."

24           Section 2. This act shall become effective on the  
25 first day of the third month following its passage and  
26 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
