| 24 | Willie Dean Mount. The monthly appropriations shall be payable |
| 25 | as non-employee compensation from any funds available for the |
| 26 | operation of the office of the sheriff. The monthly |
| 27 | appropriation of one thousand three hundred seventy-nine |

dollars and ninety-five cents (\$1,379.95) shall be reduced by
any and all amounts of workmen's compensation or disability
payments payable to and received by Willie Dean Mount, but
shall in no event shall the amount be less than six hundred
eighty-three dollars and ninety-five cents (\$683.95) per
month.

"Section 2. The operation of this act, as amended by the act amending this section, shall be retroactive to the date that the combined sum of worker's compensation benefits and Social Security disability benefits equaled one thousand three hundred seventy-nine dollars and ninety-five cents (\$1,379.95), and all actions taken and payments made pursuant thereto on and after that date are ratified and confirmed."

Section 2. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
