18	WHEREAS, initially, Hobson City was a section of the
19	town of Oxford, Alabama, known as Mooree Quarter, where black
20	residents lived; and
21	WHEREAS, as a result of the white residents'
22	resentment for the black residents' influence in town
23	politics, Oxford's mayor petitioned the state government to
24	redraw the corporate boundaries of Oxford and exclude Mooree
25	Quarter; and
26	WHEREAS, notably, 125 black residents petitioned the
27	county court to incorporate the excluded section as Hobson

City on July 20, 1899; Hobson City was named in honor of
Richmond Pearson Hobson, a naval hero of the Spanish-American
War; and

WHEREAS, on August 16, 1899, Hobson City, became the only municipality in Alabama governed entirely by black citizens and the second municipality in the United States to be governed entirely by black citizens; and

WHEREAS, Hobson City boasted three churches in the early days and currently has five; its first school, the Hobson City and Oxford Academy, was established in 1905; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, Hobson City formed a bountiful community garden for residents to enjoy and cultivate; and

WHEREAS, Hobson City will celebrate Founder's Day August 14-15, 2015; and

WHEREAS, through the years, Hobson City has produced remarkable citizens and leaders devoted to positively impacting the community and the entire state; Hobson City is truly a Southern gem that has successfully preserved the area's rich history and culture; Hobson City's contributions reflect immense credit upon the entire State of Alabama; now therefore,
