Sections 29-1-10, 29-2-52, 29-2-200, 6 7 29-2-201, 29-4-20, 29-4-22, 29-4-25, 29-4-30, 29-4-32, 29-4-35, 29-4-40, 29-4-42, 29-5-2, 29-5-3, 29-5-4, 29-5-13, 8 29-6-1, 29-6-2, 29-6-3, 29-6-4, and 29-6-7 of Code of Alabama 9 10 1975, are amended to read as follow: "§29-1-10. 11 12 "(a) There shall be appropriated out of from the 13 General Fund to the Treasury of the State of Alabama to the 14 Legislature the sum of \$100,000 one hundred thousand dollars

15 <u>(\$100,000)</u>, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the 16 expenses of the Legislature in its 10-day or organization 17 <u>organizational</u> session and for the expense of such legislative 18 interim committees as may be created by said <u>the</u> Legislature.

"(b) There shall be appropriated from the General
 Fund to the Legislature funds sufficient for the additional
 expenses incurred and payable to the members of the
 Legislature and for the operations of the Legislature during
 any special session called by the Governor, as certified by
 the Legislative Council.

26 "(a) The committee shall make a continuous study of27 the reapportionment problems in Alabama seeking solutions

thereto, and shall seek expertise, when deemed necessary, from among knowledgeable state officials and employees, academic personnel and others involved in demographic studies and other census matters.

5 "(b) The committee shall make such reports of its 6 investigations, findings and recommendations to the 7 Legislature at any time, during any regular or special session 8 of the Legislature, as it may deem necessary.

9 "(c) The committee shall engage in such activities 10 as it deems necessary for the preparation and formulation of a 11 reapportionment plan for the next ensuing reapportionment and 12 each reapportionment thereafter, and readjustment or 13 alteration of Senate and House districts and of congressional 14 districts of the state.

perform any acts that may be necessary, desirable, or proper
to carry out the purposes and objectives of the provisions
herein set forth.

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1 "(f) The committee may complete any contract 2 executed and conduct any business undertaken or commenced by the Legislature pertaining to or connected with the 3 reapportionment and readjustment or alteration of Senate and 4 House and congressional districts prior to the enactment of 5 6 this article, and the same shall be completed and conducted in 7 the same manner and under the same terms and conditions and with the same effect as if completed and conducted by the 8 9 Legislature.

10 "(g) The committee may meet within and without the 11 state, hold public hearings, and otherwise have all of the 12 powers of a legislative committee under the legislative law.

13 "(h) The committee may request and receive from any 14 court, department, division, board or bureau, commission, or 15 agency of the state or any political subdivision thereof such 16 assistance and data as will enable it to properly carry out 17 its powers and duties hereunder.

"§29-2-200.

"(a) The <u>Leqislative Council succeeds to the powers</u>
 <u>and duties of the</u> Legislative Building Authority is created as
 a continuing permanent committee of the Legislature.

"(b) The authority shall consist of three members of
the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
Senate and three members of the House of Representatives
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

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1	" (c) The membership of the authority shall be
2	inclusive and reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban
3	and rural, and economic diversity of the state.

26	to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per
27	diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a

Upon requisitions signed by the 2 chair of the authority, these payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means 3 4 of warrants drawn by the state Comptroller on the State 5 Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when 6 7 the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any 8 other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state 9 business.

10 "(i) (b) The powers and duties of the authority
 11 Legislative Council shall include all of the following:

"(1) Accept Accepting title to State House property.

"(2) Provide Except as otherwise provided by law,
 providing for the management and supervision, administration,
 improvement, equipping, operation, and maintenance of such
 State House property.

"(3) Take Taking any other action considered
necessary by the authority Legislative Council to ensure
sufficient space and facilities for the functions of the
Legislative Department.

"(a)(1) For purposes of this article, State House
property means the real property bordered by Union Street,
McDowell Lee Lane, Ripley Street, and Washington Avenue and
the building, parking deck, and improvements located thereon.

"(2) The Alabama Building Renovation Finance
Authority, hereafter referred to as ABRFA, created pursuant to

Article 14 (commencing with Section 41-10-450) of Chapter 10 of Title 41, shall execute and deliver on June 14, 2007, an appropriate deed or deeds and accompanying documents conveying State House property in fee simple absolute to the Legislative Building Authority.

6 "(3) Upon delivery of the deed and documents, the 7 Legislative Building Authority shall be invested with all 8 rights and title to the State House property.

13 "(b) The right of reverter created in Section 14 41-10-470, in relation to the land upon which the Alabama 15 State House is situated is abolished on the date of the 16 conveyance.

17 "(c) Any statutory lien created under Section 18 41-10-472, in relation to the land upon which the Alabama 19 State House is situated is abolished on the date of the 20 conveyance.

21 "(d) The Legislative Building Authority shall be
22 vested with absolute title and control of the State House
23 property.

24 "(e) Commencing October 1, 2015, absolute title and
 25 control of the State House property shall transfer to the
 26 Legislative Council by operation of law.

27 "§29-4-20.

"(a) The subordinate officers of the Senate consist
of the Secretary of the Senate and an Assistant Secretary of
the Senate. The Secretary of the Senate shall be a full-time
employee, elected as provided by law, and compensated as
provided in this chapter.

"(b) The Secretary of the Senate, after serving in 6 7 that capacity for nine successive years, shall attain continuing service status and may be removed only for cause by 8 a vote of a majority of the members elected to the Senate 9 after 10 days' notice of the intention to vote thereon 10 together with a written notice of the cause for such removal. 11 12 The service herein provided shall begin on the date of the 13 original election to such office, whether such original election occurred prior to May 1, 1973, or otherwise. fixed by the Senate Legislative Council.

24 "(d) Nothing herein shall prohibit the Assistant
 25 Secretary of the Senate from being employed as a legislative
 26 employee when the Legislature is not in session, but in no

event shall he or she be paid or receive compensation for more
 than one employment at any one time.

3 "(e) (d) The Secretary of the Senate may appoint an
4 administrative assistant. The administrative assistant to the
5 Secretary shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary and
6 shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Legislature an
7 amount fixed by the Secretary Senate Legislative Council in
8 accordance with that of comparable positions established under
9 the State Merit System pay plan.

10 "(f) (e) The Secretary of the Senate may employ a 11 chief clerk who shall be a full-time employee. The chief clerk 12 shall serve at the pleasure of the Secretary of the Senate and 13 shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Legislature an 14 amount fixed by the Secretary Senate Legislative Council in 15 accordance with that of comparable positions established under 16 the State Merit System pay plan.

"(a) The Secretary of the Senate shall <u>be elected at</u>
<u>the beginning of the quadrennium, and</u> receive an annual salary
of such amount as has heretofore or as may hereafter be fixed
<u>by law, payable as the salaries of other state officers or</u>
<u>employees are paid provided by the Senate Legislative Council.</u>

"(b) The compensation of the Assistant Secretary of
the Senate shall be fixed by the Secretary of the Senate. The

The administrative assistant to the Clerk shall serve at the pleasure of the Clerk and shall be paid from funds appropriated to the Legislature an amount fixed by the Clerk <u>House Legislative</u> <u>Council</u> in accordance with that of comparable positions established under the State Merit System pay plan.

"(f) (d) The Clerk of the House of Representatives 18 may employ a chief clerk who shall be a full-time employee. 19 The chief clerk shall serve at the pleasure of the Clerk of 20 21 the House of Representatives and shall be paid from funds 22 appropriated to the Legislature an amount fixed by the Clerk 23 of the House of Representatives House Legislative Council in 24 accordance with that of comparable positions established under 25 the State Merit System pay plan.

Members shall be entitled to 13 transportation allowances and to their regular legislative pay 14 15 and per diem expenses for each day in which they are actually engaged in committee work. 16

"The Director of the Legislative Fiscal Office shall 18 be selected and appointed by the Joint Fiscal Committee 19 Legislative Council, upon the unanimous recommendation of the 20 Chairs of the House Ways and Means Committees (Education and 21 22 General Fund) and the Chairs of the Finance and Taxation Committees (Education and General Fund), who, together, shall 23 constitute and be known as the Fiscal Committee of the 24 Legislative Council. The council consists of the Speaker of the House, the House Majority Leader, the House Minority 18 Leader, the Chairs of the Ways and Means General Fund and Ways 19 and Means Education Committees, two members of the House 20 appointed by the Speaker, two members of the House elected by 21 22 the House, and one member of the House elected by members of 23 the House who are not members of the majority party, who shall 24 constitute the House Legislative Council, and the President 25 Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Senate Majority Leader, the Senate Minority Leader, the Chairs of the Finance and Taxation 26 27 General Fund and Finance and Taxation Education Committees,

4	members of the majority party, who shall constitute the Senate
5	Legislative Council. Until January 14, 2019, the President of
6	the Senate is a full voting member of the Senate Legislative
7	Council. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d), the
8	elected House and Senate members shall be elected at the first
9	regular session of each quadrennium.
10	"(b) Members serving ex officio, appointed, or
11	elected at the 2015 Regular Session pursuant to the act adding
12	this subsection or appointed as otherwise provided in
13	subsection (d), shall replace the members of the Legislative
14	Council serving on the council on the effective date of the
15	act adding this subsection.
16	"(c) Members of the council may serve on the council
17	as long as the member retains the office that qualified the
18	member for service or during the term to which the member was
19	appointed or elected and, if reelected to the same house
20	without a break in service to that house, during the
21	succeeding legislative term until a successor is appointed or
22	elected as provided by law. No member may be elected to more
23	than two consecutive four-year terms and no member may be
24	appointed to more than two consecutive four-year terms. Any
25	member serving ex officio may remain on the Legislative
26	Council as long as the member holds the office qualifying the
27	member for membership. If a vacancy occurs in its elected

1	membership while the Legislature is not in session, the House
2	Legislative Council or the Senate Legislative Council, as

"(7) Organize and conduct an annual meeting meetings 3 4 as needed within the state for scholarly discussions of current problems in Alabama law, bringing together 5 representatives of the Legislature, practicing attorneys, 6 7 members of the bench and bar, and representatives of the law teaching profession and periodically conduct training and 8 continuing education programs for public officials, including 9 10 providing educational material.

Its reports, studies and recommended 22 publications shall be printed and shall be distributed by the 23 Secretary of State in the same manner as acts of the 24 Legislature.

"§41-9-370. 25

"The Commission on Uniform State Laws is continued 26 27 in existence as an advisory commission to the Legislature. The

1 commission consists of three members of the bar appointed by 2 the Governor for a term of four years or until their successors are appointed, any resident of this state who 3 4 because of long service in the cause of the uniformity of 5 state legislation has been elected a life member of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, 6 7 any person who while a member attended 10 or more annual 8 meetings of the National Conference of Commissioners on 9 Uniform State Laws, any resident of the state who is serving 10 or has served as Executive Director of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, a member of the Senate 11 12 appointed by the President of the Senate, a member of the 13 House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the 14 House, the Director of the Alabama Law Institute, and the 15 Director of the Legislative Reference Service. "§41-9-374. 16 17 "(a) The Commission on Uniform State Laws shall annually present its budget to the Legislative Council for 18 approval. 19 20 "(b) From funds appropriated to for the commission, 21 the commission shall:

"(1) Reimburse members of the commission who are not
members of the Legislature for their necessary expenses in
performing the duties of their offices, including travel for
the meeting of the National Conference of Commissioners on
Uniform State Laws, subject to the approval of the Legislative
Council.

"(2) Pay the cost of printing the commission's
 reports.

3 "(3) Pay the dues of this state to the National
4 Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.

5 "(b) (c) The amount of expenses and dues shall be 6 certified to the state Comptroller by the chair of the 7 commission, and the state Comptroller shall draw warrants and 8 the State Treasurer shall pay the warrants for these purposes 9 from funds appropriated for the commission.

10 "(c) For performing their duty as a member of the 11 commission, members of the commission who are members of the 12 Legislature shall receive, from funds appropriated to the 13 Legislature, the same compensation, expenses, and travel 14 allowances as members of the Legislative Council receive for 15 travel out-of-state on Legislative Council business.

"§41-19-3.

IT is the purpose of this chapter to establish a comprehensive system for budgeting and financial management which furthers the capacity of the Governor and the Legislature to plan and finance the services which they determine the state will provide for citizens. The system shall include procedures for all of the following:

"(1) The orderly establishment, continuing review,
and periodic revision of the program and financial goals and
policies of the state.

"(2) The development, coordination, and review of
 long-range program and financial plans that will implement
 established state goals and policies.

4 "(3) The preparation, coordination, analysis, and
5 enactment of a budget, organized to focus on state services
6 and their costs, that authorizes the implementation of
7 policies and plans in the succeeding budget period.

8 "(4) The evaluation of alternatives to existing 9 policies, plans, and procedures that offer potential for more 10 efficient or effective state services.

11 "(5) The regular appraisal and reporting of program 12 performance.

13 "To this end, each Governor shall develop a 14 four-year strategic plan for presentation to the Legislature 15 prior to the first day of the second regular legislative session in each term of office. The plan shall include 16 17 program, long-range revenue and expenditure plans for the quadrennium, improvements in the state infrastructure 18 requiring capital outlay, and recommended steps to reduce the 19 20 cost of operation of state government. In addition, the plan 21 shall include a pilot phase of implementation for 22 performance-based budgeting with one or more state agencies. The Joint Fiscal Committee and the Governor shall jointly 23 24 select state agencies to participate in said pilot phase for 25 the 1996-97 fiscal year. "§41-19-3.1. 26

1 "The Joint Fiscal Committee Legislative Council 2 shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Governor in the 3 development of the long-range program, revenue and expenditure 4 plans. The Joint Fiscal Committee Legislative Council shall be 5 aided by the Legislative Fiscal Office. Members of the Joint 6 Fiscal Committee shall be compensated as provided for in 7 Section 29-5-2."

Section 3. (a) If the senator who is serving as the 8 9 President Pro Tempore of the Senate on the date of the general 10 election at which members of the Senate are elected to 11 four-year terms is reelected to the Senate, the senator shall 12 continue to serve as President Pro Tempore of the Senate until 13 a successor President Pro Tempore is selected pursuant to 14 Section 48.01 of the Official Recompilation of the 15 Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended.

(b) If the senator serving as the President Pro 16 17 Tempore of the Senate ceases service as a Senator for any reason prior to election of a President Pro Tempore pursuant 18 19 to Section 48.01 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, then, with the 20 21 approval of the Senate Legislative Council, the Secretary of 22 the Senate shall perform the functions of the President Pro 23 Tempore with respect to the expenditure of funds appropriated 24 to the office of the President Pro Tempore until a successor 25 President Pro Tempore is elected pursuant to Section 48.01 of 26 the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 27 1901, as amended.

Section 4. Sections 29-1-22, 29-1-41 <u>29-4-41</u>, and
 29-7-5 of the Code of Alabama 1975 are repealed.

3 Section 5. Those portions of this act relating to 4 the composition of the Legislative Council as well as Sections 5 2, 3, and 4 shall become effective immediately following its 6 passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise 7 becoming law. The remainder of the act shall become effective 8 October 1, 2015.
