25	Section 1. (a) The Commissioner of the Department of
26	Conservation and Natural Resources may require the possession
27	of an endorsement, stamp, or special license in order to

harvest or attempt to harvest specific species or species groups of marine resources. The commissioner shall establish the requirements and any associated fees for an endorsement, stamp, or license by rule. All fees derived from endorsements, stamps, or special licenses issued pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the Marine Resources Fund and shall only be used for the management and development of the species or species group for which an endorsement, stamp, or special license was issued. Any endorsement, stamp, or special license required pursuant to this section and any associated fees shall be in addition to any other license or fee otherwise required by law.

(b) For purposes of this section, the term "marine resources" means those resources subject to the jurisdiction of the Division of Marine Resources of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
