8 SYNOPSIS: This bill makes an appropriation of
9 \$5,000,000 from the Education Trust Fund to the
10 Alabama Community College System for the purpose of
11 providing student scholarships in career-technical
12 dual enrollment programs, for the fiscal year
13 ending September 30, 2016.

19 To make an appropriation of \$5,000,000 from the
20 Education Trust Fund to the Alabama Community College System
21 for the purpose of providing student scholarships in
22 career-technical dual enrollment programs, for the fiscal year
23 ending September 30, 2016.

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

25 Section 1. There is hereby appropriated the sum of
26 \$5,000,000 from the Education Trust Fund to the Alabama
27 Community College System for the purpose of providing student

1 scholarships in career-technical dual enrollment programs, for
2 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016.

3 Section 2. The above appropriation is made for the
4 support of student scholarships for career-technical dual
5 enrollment programs that are designed or implemented by the
6 Chancellor of the Department of Postsecondary Education and
7 offered at Alabama Community College System institutions. The
8 Chancellor of the Department of Postsecondary Education shall
9 ensure that the above appropriation for student scholarships
10 is allocated to students in a manner consistent with
11 addressing the identified needs in each workforce regions
12 regarding career-technical dual enrollment programs.

13 Section 3. This act shall become effective October
14 1, 2015.
