BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. (a) The Retirement Systems of Alabama shall cause a biannual audit of its investment portfolio to be made by an independent auditing firm which customarily audits retirement systems and the audit shall be presented on or before the tenth legislative day of each regular session of the Legislature.

(b) This biannual audit shall be performed based upon industry best practices and shall compare plan expenses, portfolio allocations, and actual returns to other states that have comparable plans. The audit shall provide data covering compensation of employees of the RSA to ensure Alabama is within industry norms. The audit shall focus on private placement investments within the system to ensure only best practices, arms-length transactions are executed.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
