17	Section 1. This act shall apply only in Chilton
18	County.
19	Section 2. The judge of probate of the county shall
20	call an election in conjunction with the next statewide
21	primary or general election for the county to determine
22	whether alcoholic beverages may be legally sold or distributed
23	in the county on any day except Sunday. On the ballot to be
24	used for the wet-dry referendum election, the question shall
25	be in the following form: "Do you favor the legal sale and
26	distribution of alcoholic beverages within Chilton County on
27	any day except Sunday? Yes , No ."

(b) The election shall be held and the officers appointed to hold the election in the manner provided by law for holding other county elections, and the returns thereof tabulated and results certified as provided by law for county elections.

- (c) Notice of the election shall be given by the judge of probate by publication or by posting the notice at the courthouse apprising the voters of the county, at least three weeks before the date of the election, that an election shall be held to determine whether alcoholic beverages may be sold in the county. The cost of the election shall be paid out of the general fund of the county.
- (d) Only qualified voters may vote in the election. If a majority of the voters of the county voting in the county election vote "Yes," alcoholic beverages may be legally sold, distributed, and consumed within the county on any day except Sunday. If a majority of the voters voting in the county election vote "No," alcoholic beverages may not be sold or dispensed in the county. A no vote may not be construed as a repeal of the right to sell alcoholic beverages within municipalities located in the county where alcoholic beverages may be legally sold, distributed, and consumed.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
