defined in Sections 13A-6-61 to 13A-6-69, inclusive, Code of
Alabama 1975, to submit to a polygraph examination or other
truth-telling device as a condition of proceeding with the
investigation of the offense. The refusal of a victim to
submit to an examination shall not prevent the investigation,
charging, prosecution, trial, or sentencing of an alleged
sexual offense.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
