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- (b) The goal of the commission is to study tick borne illnesses in Alabama and make suggestions for the treatment of and reduction and eradication of tick borne illnesses in the state.
- (c) The commission shall be charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- (1) Upon adjournment of the 2015 Regular Legislative Session, the commission shall schedule an initial meeting to organize and discuss a plan of action and shall meet as necessary thereafter to achieve its goals.
- (2) The commission shall report its findings and any proposed legislation to the Speaker of the House and President Pro Tempore of the Senate by January 16, 2016, whereupon it shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duty or liability.
- (d) Upon request of the chair of the commission, the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the commission.
- (e) Each legislative member of the commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a
