170247-1:n:05/28/2015:KBH/th LRS2015-2158 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 MOURNING THE DEATH OF FRANK CALLOWAY. 8 9 10 WHEREAS, with profound sorrow and regret, we mourn the death of Mr. Frank Calloway of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, who 11 12 passed away on Monday, September 1, 2014, at the 13 self-proclaimed age of 118 years; and 14 WHEREAS, Mr. Calloway was born on July 2nd sometime 15 between 1896 and 1913 in Montgomery, Alabama; he spent his life as a laborer, working mostly on farms, logging, and 16 17 building roads; and WHEREAS, he developed a love for drawing and art as 18 a small child, but the long hours working prevented him from 19 pursuing his passion; it was not until he was about 86 years 20 21 old that he got serious about his art and he hit his stride with his artwork at the age of 112; and 22 23 WHEREAS, his drawings were done on sheets of butcher paper, sometimes more than 30 feet long, and depicted rural 24 agricultural scenes with buildings, trains, and vehicles 25 26 straight out of the early 20th century; and

1 WHEREAS, Mr. Calloway was diagnosed with 2 schizophrenia in 1952, so he spent much of his life living in 3 state mental health facilities; he was the longest living 4 resident known to the state mental health system and the 5 longest resident to live in a state hospital; he was moved to 6 a community living facility in 2009; and

7 WHEREAS, he was a lively and well-loved member of 8 the mental health community; anyone who knew anything about 9 mental health in the state knew of Mr. Calloway and his 10 artwork; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we record the death of Mr. Frank Calloway with deep sadness, and by copy of this resolution we extend our heartfelt sympathy to his family and friends, whose grief is shared by many.
