3                   COMMENDING THE WALLACE STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
4 SOFTBALL TEAM.

6                   WHEREAS, the Wallace State Community College  
7 Softball Team won its ninth Alabama Community College  
8 Conference Championship and its tenth straight ACCC North  
9 Division title; and

10                   WHEREAS, Wallace State made its third NJCAA Division  
11 I National Tournament appearance in four seasons and ninth  
12 appearance overall, finishing the season with a 62-14 record;  
13 and

14                   WHEREAS, the Lady Lions were ranked among the Top 10  
15 teams in the nation all season and earned a No. 2 seed at the  
16 National Junior College Athletic Association Division I  
17 National Tournament in St. George, Utah, their highest  
18 national tournament seed ever; and

19                   WHEREAS, Wallace State softball Coach Jayne Clem  
20 reached an 800-win milestone with the Lady Lions on March 28  
21 in a 6-0 victory over Marion Military Institute; Clem  
22 maintains an 823-217 record, a .791 winning percentage, after  
23 16 seasons at Wallace State; and

24                   WHEREAS, Wallace State sophomore Rachel Ragland was  
25 named the ACCC Player of the Year; she finished the season

1 with a 25-7 record, seven saves, and a conference best 1.32  
2 ERA, recording 210 strikeouts and nine shutouts; at the plate  
3 Ragland finished with five homeruns and 29 RBI's; and

4 WHEREAS, Ragland was a first-team All-ACCC North  
5 Division member along with sophomore second baseman Mackenzie  
6 Hill and freshman third baseman Katie Parr; and

7 WHEREAS, sophomore pitcher Amanda Medders and  
8 sophomore outfielder Sarah Jordan were each named to the  
9 All-ACCC North Division second team; and

10 WHEREAS, freshman first baseman Sam Riley was named  
11 the ACCC Conference Tournament Most Valuable Player; Medders,  
12 Hill, and Jordan were also named to the All-Tournament team;  
13 and

14 WHEREAS, Wallace State softball has a long-standing  
15 tradition of excellence, winning national titles in 2008 and  
16 2013; and

17 WHEREAS, the Wallace State softball team is  
18 routinely named among the NJCAA's All-Academic Teams, and its  
19 players recognized for academic excellence; now therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
21 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Wallace State softball  
22 team is to be commended for outstanding achievement in 2015,  
23 and a copy of this resolution is provided to the team with our  
24 best wishes for the future.
