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21	To amend Section 34-24-604, Code of Alabama 1975,
22	relating to annual registrations and fees for physicians
23	providing pain management services for physician practice
24	locations; to provide that each such physician shall pay one
25	registration fee or annual renewal fee with no additional fee
26	for additional practice locations.
27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

1 Section 1. Section 34-24-604, Code of Alabama 1975, 2 is amended to read as follows: "§34-24-604. 3 "(a) Beginning January 1, 2014, and continuing each 4 year thereafter: 5 "(1) All physicians providing pain management 6 7 services shall obtain a pain management registration from the board. 8 "(2) All physicians who otherwise meet the criteria 9 10 established by the board shall obtain a pain management 11 registration from the board. 12 "(b) To register, a physician applicant shall submit the following to the board: 13 14 "(1) A completed application on a form prescribed by 15 the board. "(2) Proof of a current drug enforcement 16 17 administration registration. "(3) Proof of an Alabama controlled substances 18 certificate. 19 "(4) Proof of a current registration with the 20 21 Alabama Prescription Drug Monitoring Program. 22 "(5) A list of all registrants who own, co-own, 23 operate, or provide pain management services in the practice 24 location. "(6) The disclosure of any controlled substances 25 26 certificate or registration denial, restriction, or discipline

1 imposed on the registrant, or any disciplinary act against the 2 license of the registrant.

"(7) Payment of the initial registration fee as set
forth in this section and in the rules of the Alabama Board of
Medical Examiners.

6 "(8) A certification listing the current name of the 7 physician who will serve as the medical director.

8 "(9) Any other information requested by the board 9 related to the qualifications to, or the provision of, 10 providing pain management services.

11 "(c) The applicant shall provide the board with a 12 physical address for each location where he or she provides 13 pain management services and a list of all physicians who work at the practice location, including the name of the physician 14 who will serve as the medical director. For purposes of this 15 subsection, if a practice location is a hospital, the 16 17 physician applicant is not required to provide the names of physicians at the hospital other than the medical director. 18

19 "(d) Exemptions. The provisions of this article20 shall not apply to any of the following:

"(1) A hospice program licensed by the Alabama
Department of Public Health, or any physicians while
performing work for that program.

"(2) A facility maintained or operated by the United
States or any of its departments, offices, or agencies, or any
physicians while performing work for that facility.

1 "(e) The board shall provide individual, entity, and 2 any categorical exemptions as, in its discretion, it deems 3 appropriate.

"(f) Any physician who is not included in
subdivisions (1) and (2) of subsection (d) may petition the
board for an exemption from the requirements of this section
for working at a particular entity. The board shall have the
sole discretion in determining whether the requested exemption
shall be granted or denied.

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"(g) Fees.

"(1) An initial registration fee is provided in an amount set by the board in its rules not to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300).

14 "(2) Renewal fee. A renewal fee is provided in an 15 amount set by the board in its rules not to exceed three 16 hundred dollars (\$300).

17 "(3) There shall be no initial registration fee or
18 renewal fee for additional practice locations.

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"(h) Miscellaneous.

20 "(1) An applicant practicing in more than one
 21 location shall submit a separate registration fee for each
 22 practice.

23 "(2)(1) If an applicant does not complete the 24 initial application process within 90 days of his or her first 25 submission to the board, then the application shall be closed, 26 the application fee shall not be refunded, and the applicant 27 shall be required to reapply for registration.

1	" $(3)$ (2) An application which is submitted to the
2	board may be withdrawn at any time prior to the granting or
3	denial of registration; provided, however, that the
4	application fee shall not be refunded.
5	"(i) Renewal.
6	"(1) A registration by a physician under this
7	article shall expire on December 31 of each year.
8	"(2) A registrant may renew a current registration
9	prior to its expiration date by submitting the following to
10	the board:
11	"a. A renewal application form prescribed by the
12	board.
13	"b. The required renewal fee.
14	"c. A certification that each location at which the
15	applicant provides pain management service has a medical
16	director.
17	"d. If the practice location is not a hospital, an
18	attestation that the practice location is not owned wholly or
19	partly by a person who has been convicted of or pled nolo
20	contendre to any of the following:
21	"1. A felony.
22	"2. An offense that constitutes a misdemeanor, the
23	facts of which relate to the distribution or illegal
24	prescription of any controlled substance.
25	"e. Any applicant who has been convicted of a crime
26	described in paragraph d. may request an interview before the

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board, after which the board may approve or deny the registration.

3 "f. Any other information requested by the board."
4 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
5 first day of the third month following its passage and
6 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
