20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:	
21 Section 1. For purposes of this act, the following	ng
22 terms have the following meanings:	
23 (1) CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY CRAFT TRAINING FEES.	
24 Revenues received by the state in the form of federal, stat	te,
local, or private sector grants for the purpose of funding	
26 construction industry craft training programs and fees imp	osed

1 as authorizing the collection of fees. No fee from any 2 licensed home builder, as defined in Chapter 14A of Title 34, Code of Alabama 1975; any subcontractor working on a 3 4 residential construction site including renovations to any residential structure; or from any person or entity 5 specifically exempt under Chapter 14A of Title 34, Code of 6 7 Alabama 1975, except for subdivision (3) of Section 34-14A-6, Code of Alabama 1975. 8

9 (2) CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY CRAFT TRAINING PROGRAM. A
 10 program to be administered within the Alabama Building
 11 Commission, or successor agency or department.

12 Section 2. The Craft Training Fund is created for the benefit of the State of Alabama and its citizens and shall 13 14 continue to exist as a special fund in the State Treasury and 15 shall be funded with the construction industry craft training fees and administered solely in accordance with Section 3 and 16 17 the decisions of the Craft Training Board. The revenue received by the fund shall be invested by the State Treasurer 18 in permitted investments until the Craft Training Board uses 19 20 money for the purposes established in that section. Earnings 21 on permitted investments shall remain a part of the fund.

22 Section 3. (a) It is the intent of the Legislature 23 to establish and provide for a coordinated effort between the 24 construction industry and institutions of higher education and 25 other entities, including, but not limited to, union training 26 programs, to enhance the availability and quality of programs 27 which promote construction industry craft training and education, and thereby enhance the availability and competence
 of the work force for supporting the industry.

(b) In order to provide for efficient, competent, 3 4 and resourceful construction industry craft training programs that will deliver the knowledge and skills necessary for 5 persons to learn and meet the skill requirements for a craft 6 7 and career in the construction industry trades and thereby enhance the development of a quality labor pool to support the 8 9 construction industry of this state, there is established within the Alabama Building Commission, or successor agency or 10 11 department, a program to be known as the Alabama Construction 12 Industry Craft Training Program. The program shall be managed 13 and governed by the Craft Training Board which shall consist 14 of seven members selected as follows:

(1) Two voting members appointed by the Governor
from a list of six members, or member representatives, of the
Associated Builders and Contractors of Alabama, Incorporated,
or its successor, submitted to the Governor by the Associated
Builders and Contractors of Alabama, Incorporated.

(2) Two voting members appointed by the Governor
from a list of six members, or member representatives, of the
Associated General Contractors of America, Incorporated, or
its successor, submitted to the Governor by the Associated
General Contractors of America, Incorporated.

(3) One voting member appointed by the Governor from
a list of three members, or member representatives, of the
Subcontractors Association of Alabama, or its successor,

submitted to the Governor by the Subcontractors Association of
 Alabama.

3 (4) One voting member appointed by the Governor from
4 a list of three members, or member representatives, of the
5 Birmingham Construction Industry Authority, or its successor,
6 submitted to the Governor by the Birmingham Construction
7 Industry Authority.

8 (5) One voting member to be appointed by the 9 Governor from a list of three members, or member 10 representatives, of the Construction Users Roundtable, or its 11 successor, submitted to the Governor by the Construction Users 12 Roundtable.

13 (c) When a craft training board member resigns or 14 otherwise relinquishes membership in the organization that 15 recommended his or her appointment by the Governor, the resignation or relinguishment shall automatically result in 16 17 forfeiture of membership on the board. Any vacancy on the board shall be filled by appointment by the Governor upon the 18 recommendation of the relevant organization for the remainder 19 20 of the unexpired term.

(d) Appointments to the craft training board shall
be made by October 15, 2015. Each board member shall serve for
a three-year term and until a successor is appointed,
qualified, and assumes office. Board members shall be
ineligible for reappointment. The organizational meeting of
the board shall be held during the last 10 days of October
2015 at the time and place determined by the board members

1 representing the Alabama Associated General Contractors of 2 America, Incorporated. At the first meeting, the craft training board shall elect its chair and officers. Thereafter, 3 4 the board shall determine its meeting schedule. The board shall meet at least quarterly. No member shall draw any salary 5 6 for any service he or she may render or for any duty he or she 7 may perform in connection with the board, but shall be entitled to reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred that 8 are directly related to the duties in serving as a member of 9 10 the board. The board may also appoint geographically oriented advisory committees and invite local employers and employees 11 12 in the construction industry to relate specific labor force 13 problems that may be solved by the craft training program. The 14 advisory committees may be composed of individuals who are not 15 craft training board members.

(e) In addition to any other power established
pursuant to this act, the craft training board shall have the
following powers to be exercised in its discretion:

19 (1) To develop curricula for use in craft training20 programs.

(2) To establish forms, criteria, guidelines, and
 procedures regarding construction industry craft training
 programs and procedures to be used in requesting
 appropriations of funds from the Craft Training Fund.

(3) To solicit and receive from institutions of
higher education and other entities, including, but not
limited to, union training programs, applications for use of

1 monies in the Craft Training Fund, to be used in the 2 implementation of craft training programs and in accordance 3 with this act.

4 (4) To disburse funds from the Craft Training Fund
5 consistent with this section and which the Craft Training
6 Board deems appropriate and under such conditions and terms as
7 the Craft Training Board deems appropriate.

(5) To provide grants to educational, governmental, 8 9 nonprofit, community-based, workforce development, economic 10 development, and other organizations and associations engaged 11 in the education, training, and professional development of 12 persons engaged in activities leading to the furtherance of careers in nonresidential construction in accordance with the 13 14 purposes of this act and which the Craft Training Board deems 15 appropriate, and under such conditions and terms as the Craft 16 Training Board deems appropriate.

17 (f) The Craft Training Board shall have exclusive control over the expenditure of all funds in the Craft 18 Training Fund, as well as the exclusive authority to exercise 19 the powers specifically listed in subsection (e). A majority 20 21 of the members of the Craft Training Board shall constitute a 22 quorum for the transaction of any and all business of the 23 Craft Training Board. The director, technical staff, and 24 support personnel of the Alabama Building Commission, or 25 successor agency or department, shall implement the resolutions and decisions of the Craft Training Board. The 26 27 Craft Training Board shall be responsible for reimbursing the

Alabama Building Commission, or successor agency or
 department, from the Craft Training Fund the costs it incurs
 in order to administer the program.

Section 4. (a) In order to fund the construction industry craft training program, a fee in the amount of one dollar (\$1) per each one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of construction authorized on the issuance of any nonresidential construction building permit issued by any county, city, town, or other political subdivision of this state is imposed.

10 (b) The office of the political subdivision issuing 11 the permit shall be responsible for collecting the fee and 12 remitting it monthly to the Department of Revenue.

13 (c) There shall be appropriated to the Department of 14 Revenue as a first charge against the revenues from the fee 15 imposed by this section an amount that will offset its actual costs in the administration and regulation of this fee, which 16 17 shall not exceed five percent of the proceeds produced by such fee. The net proceeds received pursuant to this section shall 18 be deposited in the Craft Training Fund and shall be used 19 exclusively at the direction of the Craft Training Board. 20

(d) The proceeds from fees collected and deposited
into the craft training fund are appropriated for the purposes
of this act, to be expended, in whole or in part, by the Craft
Training Board.

25 Section 5. This act shall become effective following 26 its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise 27 becoming law.
