This bill would provide certain exceptions 15 and criminal penalties. 16 17 Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama 18 of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the 19 Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general 20 21 law whose purpose or effect would be to require a 22 new or increased expenditure of local funds from 23 becoming effective with regard to a local 24 governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote 25 unless: it comes within one of a number of 26 specified exceptions; it is approved by the 27 affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates

1 funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to 2 the entity for the purpose. The purpose or effect of this bill would be 3 4 to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. 5 operates primarily for the purpose of conducting scientific
6 research, a state institution, a pharmaceutical company, or a
7 biotechnology company conducting bona fide research.

8 (d) A person or business establishment knowingly and
9 unlawfully possessing a powdered alcohol product shall be
10 fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500).

(e) A person or business establishment knowingly and unlawfully selling a powdered alcohol product shall be guilty of a Class C felony.

14 Section 2. Although this bill would have as its 15 purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further 16 17 requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of 18 the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the 19 bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an 20 21 existing crime.

22 Section 3. This act shall become effective on the 23 first day of the third month following its passage and 24 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
