10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT  
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13 Relating to the City of Millbrook in Elmore and  
14 Autauga Counties; to authorize the city council to regulate  
15 and permit the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sundays under  
16 certain conditions by retail licensees of the Alcoholic  
17 Beverage Control Board; and to authorize the city council to  
18 provide for the sale of draft beer, with certain exceptions,  
19 by retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.  
20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

21 Section 1. This act shall apply only within the  
22 corporate limits of the City of Millbrook in Elmore and  
23 Autauga Counties.

24 Section 2. The City Council of the City of  
25 Millbrook, by resolution, may regulate and permit the sale for  
26 on premises consumption only of alcoholic beverages on Sunday  
27 after 12:00 p.m. upon the licensed premises of retail

1 licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of the State  
2 of Alabama and of the City of Millbrook serving the general  
3 public including, but not limited to, hotels and conference  
4 centers and golf courses located within the corporate limits  
5 of the city. Any licensee granted authority to sell alcoholic  
6 beverages on Sunday pursuant to this act shall be required to  
7 have all servers of alcoholic beverages complete responsible  
8 vendor training in the manner provided by the Alcoholic  
9 Beverage Control Board.

10 Section 3. The City Council of the City of  
11 Millbrook, by resolution, may authorize the sale and  
12 distribution of draft beer by retail licensees of the  
13 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Notwithstanding the  
14 foregoing, keg beer may not be sold for off-premises  
15 consumption.

16 Section 4. This act is cumulative and supplemental  
17 to the present power and authority of the City of Millbrook,  
18 and is not intended to, nor shall it be interpreted, to repeal  
19 any existing power or authority of the city now permitted  
20 under the general laws of the state or under any local or  
21 special act of the Legislature.

22 Section 5. This act shall become effective  
23 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
24 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
