- (b) The Chancellor of the Department of 3 Postsecondary Education, in consultation with the Commission on Higher Education, shall develop and implement a program that reduces a potential barrier to degree completion by 7 providing students the opportunity to take advantage of credits earned while attending a two-year college who transfer to a four-year college before earning an associate degree. The program shall authorize a two-year college to offer an associate degree to a student who transfers from the two-year 12 college to a four-year college and subsequently accumulates 60 13 semester hour credits. A student who meets the requirements set forth in this subsection shall be subject to a degree audit by the two-year college to determine whether the student qualifies for an associate degree, and if so, be entitled to 17 receive the associate degree from the two-year college.
 - (c) Each four-year college shall notify in writing:
 - (1) A student who meets the eligibility requirements in subsection (b) that the student qualifies for a degree audit by the two-year college from which the student transferred, and information concerning the process for a student to be awarded an associate degree in the future if the degree requirements are not met or the student declines the associate degree at the time of qualification.
 - (2) The two-year college that the student qualifies for a degree audit, along with the student's transcript.

(d) The two-year college notified pursuant to subsection (c) shall conduct a degree audit to determine whether the student qualifies for an associate degree and shall award the degree to the student unless the student declines the award. If the student does not qualify, the two-year college shall notify the student of additional courses that the student must successfully complete in order to qualify for an associate degree.

(e) Nothing in this section limits the ability of the governing boards of two-year and four-year colleges to develop reverse transfer agreements that are consistent with the intent of this section.

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
