WHEREAS, the Trans-Pacific region accounts for
nearly 60 percent of world trade and 40 percent of global GDP;
and

4 WHEREAS, U.S. exports to Asia-Pacific increased by 5 63 percent in the last five years; and

6 WHEREAS, the TPP will boost exports from the United 7 States by up to \$25 billion annually, helping to shore up the 8 American domestic economy on the heels of a recession; and

9 WHEREAS, a 2008 University of Michigan study 10 estimates that an Asia-Pacific trade agreement would increase 11 real U.S. income by 1.2 percent; and

12 WHEREAS, successful conclusion of the TPP 13 negotiations will provide economically significant new market 14 access opportunities for America's workers, farmers, ranchers, 15 service providers, and small businesses; and

16 WHEREAS, the TPP will integrate the American economy 17 across the Pacific Rim, fully engaging the United States both 18 economically and politically across four continents; and

WHEREAS, the TPP will provide an historic opportunity to improve the bilateral economic relationship with Japan, our 4th largest trading partner, by eliminating longstanding tariff and non-tariff barriers to U.S. exports of goods and services; and

24 WHEREAS, the TPP will reduce the risk of the 25 exclusionary Asian trade bloc, the Regional Comprehensive 26 Economic Partnership; and WHEREAS, the TPP will give the United States more
engagement and leadership in Asian economies; and

3 WHEREAS, the TPP will be an impetus for further 4 bilateral and multilateral trade agreements, to the benefit of 5 the United States, in the Asia-Pacific region; now therefore,

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH 7 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That the Legislature of Alabama 8 urges Congress to support negotiations for a comprehensive, 9 high-standard, and ambitious Trans-Pacific Partnership 10 Agreement that will provide a platform for regional trade and 11 economic integration.
