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9	WHEREAS, crimes perpetrated by and against juveniles
10	are a continuing concern for the State of Alabama and the
11	nation; and
12	WHEREAS, juvenile delinquency can destroy
13	unfulfilled potential in our youth; and
14	WHEREAS, the loss of young people to violent crimes
15	jeopardizes the promise of the future; and
16	WHEREAS, there is much debate about the causes and
17	remedies for juvenile crimes; and
18	WHEREAS, while there is no one cause of juvenile
19	delinquency, children who are neglected and do not receive
20	adequate adult supervision or who are encouraged by adults to
21	participate in delinquent behavior are at risk of continuing
22	to commit crimes or of becoming victims of the crimes of
23	others; and

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L	WHEREAS, society recognizes that minors need
2	protection during their development due to lack of experience,
3	maturity, and decision-making capacity; and

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WHEREAS, Alabama's public policy includes a prohibition against contributing to the delinquency of minors, codified by Section 12-15-111 of the Code of Alabama 1975, which holds parents, legal guardians, legal custodians, or other persons criminally liable for contributing to the delinquency of a minor by willfully aiding, encouraging, or causing any child to become or remain delinquent, dependent, or in need of supervision, permitting or encouraging the employment of a child in violation of child labor laws, or causing a child to fail to attend school as required by the compulsory school attendance law; and

WHEREAS, when children are placed at risk of delinquency, continuing criminal behavior, or becoming a victim of crime due to the actions or inactions of the responsible adults in their lives, the state should protect the child; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we urge law enforcement, prosecutors, and the juvenile court system to take all of the following actions:

(1) Investigate the involvement of parents, legal quardians, legal custodians, or other person having custody,

L	control, or supervision of a child subject to proceedings
2	under the Alabama Juvenile Justice Act, Chapter 15, Title 12,
3	Code of Alahama 1975

- (2) Investigate whether any other person not standing in any relation to the child has aided, encouraged, or caused the child to become delinquent, dependent, or in need of supervision.
- (3) Enforce Section 12-15-111 of the Code of Alabama 1975, when it appears to the juvenile court that a parent, legal guardian, legal custodian, or other person having custody, control, or supervision of a child or any other person not standing in any relation to the child has aided, encouraged, or caused the child to become delinquent, dependent, or in need of supervision in violation of state law.
