13	WHEREAS, according to the Federal Communications
14	Commission Chairman, 53 percent of rural Americans have no
15	access to high-speed Internet, which is defined as the
16	capability to download content at 25 megabits per second; and
17	WHEREAS, thousands of Alabamians remain without
18	access to broadband Internet services; and
19	WHEREAS, according to some sources, including the
20	Federal Communications Commission, there are almost a million
21	Alabama residents who have access to only one wired Internet
22	provider, leaving these residents with no opportunity to
23	utilize an alternate provider; and
24	WHEREAS, more than 250,000 Alabama residents depend
25	on fixed wireless or mobile broadband with low data caps for
26	their home Internet connection; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to enhance affordable access to broadband Internet, the federal government has implemented certain initiatives to build out necessary infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture has recently announced that it will offer between 40 and 50 million dollars to rural carriers that invest in introducing broadband Internet in rural areas; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that Alabama capitalize upon federal dollars to broaden Internet access in this state to further allow Alabamians in rural areas to actively participate in economic and civic life far beyond their geographic region; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That by copy of this resolution to each member of the Alabama Congressional Delegation, we hereby urge delegation members to support Alabama's participation in federal programs that enhance Internet access in rural areas and to actively advance Alabama as a pilot state in federal broadband Internet expansion programs.
