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- (9) Any other technical expert who the co-chairs of the commission believe would be helpful in accomplishing the goals of the commission.
- (b) The task force membership shall be inclusive and shall reflect the racial, gender, geographic, urban/rural, and economic diversity of the state.
- (c) The goal of the task force is to examine and review existing boards and commissions with the purpose of eliminating those that are outdated or expired.
- (d) The task force shall be charged with the following duties and responsibilities:
- (1) Upon adjournment of the Alabama 2015 Regular Legislative Session, the task force shall schedule an initial meeting to organize and discuss a plan of action and shall meet as necessary thereafter to achieve its goals.
- (2) The task force shall report its findings and any proposed legislation by the fifth day of the 2016 Regular Legislative Session, whereupon it shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duty or liability.
- (e) Upon request of the co-chairs, the Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House of Representatives shall

- provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the task force.
- 3 (f) The Legislative Fiscal Office, Legislative
 4 Reference Service, Alabama Law Institute, and Alabama
 5 Department of Revenue shall serve as resources to the task
 6 force for researching, compiling information, and drafting any
 7 recommended changes to the Code of Alabama 1975, or proposed

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(g) Each legislative member of the task force shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature.
