- 3 (d) The commission shall be charged with the 4 following duties and responsibilities:
 - (1) Upon adjournment of the 2015 Second Special Session, the commission shall schedule an initial meeting to organize, elect a chair and vice-chair, discuss a plan of action, and meet as necessary to achieve its goals.
 - (2) Report its findings and any proposed legislation to the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate not later than the 10th day of the 2016 Regular Session, whereupon it shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further liability.
 - (e) Upon request of the chair of the commission, the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the commission.
 - (f) Each legislative member of the commission shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the commission in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature.
