19	WHEREAS, a graduate of Jacksonville State University

21	former President of the Board of Trustees for Jacksonville
22	State University; and
23	WHEREAS, from 1961 through 1971, prior to his
24	political career, he was a reporter for the Birmingham
25	Post-Herald; later he wrote a series of columns for AL.com and
26	is the author of several history books including, Historic

Birmingham and Jefferson County and Tannehill and the Growth
of the Alabama Iron Industry; and

WHEREAS, while serving as Secretary of State, he also served as President of the National Association of Secretaries of State and brought the national convention of that organization to Mobile, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, with decades of involvement in government and public affairs, he was known for his unselfish service to the Citizens of Alabama; he was recently awarded the Governor's Cross, which is the highest honor bestowed by the Alabama National Guard; and

WHEREAS, Jim Bennett was a valued member of the community and loved by many, and we join with others to mourn the death of our friend and colleague; although his presence will be greatly missed, his memory will be cherished in the hearts and minds of those who were fortunate to know him and all those whom he served; now therefore,
