Aldridge on his outstanding achievement of being 14 named the winner of the Agribusiness Award and being inducted 15 into the Auburn University Agricultural Alumni Association 16 Hall of Honor; and 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Aldridge grew up helping in his 18 parents' greenhouse and nursery business in Bessemer, Alabama; 19 he developed a passion for agriculture while working in 20 Aldridge Garden Shop and Nursery, one of the nation's first full-scale retail garden centers; the business became one of 21 22 the area's best-known nurseries; and 23 WHEREAS, Mr. Aldridge, an avid plant breeder, 24 developed many new cultivars of ornamental plants and shrubs; 25 he and his father discovered, patented, and introduced the Snowflake hydrangea, an oakleaf hydrangea mutation, which now 26

1 graces gardens and landscapes across the United States and 2 around the world; and

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Aldridge purchased a 30-acre private 4 estate in Hoover where he and his wife, Kay, enhanced the 5 property with walking trails and beautiful plantings; on his 6 retirement in 1995, Mr. Aldridge donated Aldridge Gardens to 7 the City of Hoover; he is a lifetime member of its board of 8 directors; and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Aldridge has cultivated an indelible 10 legacy of excellence that is an enormous source of credit to 11 the agricultural industry and the entire State of Alabama; now 12 therefore,
