11	WHEREAS, the citizens of Alabama expect and deserve

 - (a) The committee shall be composed of the following:

- (1) Seven members of the House appointed by the Speaker of the House, two of whom must be members of the minority caucus in the House.
- (2) Seven members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, two of whom must be members of the minority caucus in the Senate.
- (b) The task force shall evaluate and recommend changes to state budgeting practices including, but not limited to:
- (1) Implementing a biennial budgeting cycle for the Education Trust Fund and General Fund.
 - (2) Requiring state entities to undergo greater performance and program reviews.
 - (3) Unearmarking funds in order to provide for greater legislative oversight and appropriating flexibility.
 - (4) Reviewing existing state tax credits, deductions, and exemptions that result in the loss of approximately \$4.5 billion in revenue to our state budgets each year, and creating a policy to ensure that future tax credits effectively provide economic gain to the state.

task force, which must be held not later than September 30,

2016. The task force shall elect a chair and vice-chair at its

first meeting. Upon the request of the chair, the Clerk of the

House and the Secretary of the Senate shall provide necessary

clerical assistance for the work of the task force.

- (2) The task force shall meet monthly and shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the fifth legislative day of the 2017 Regular Session, whereupon the task force shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities.
- (d) Each member of the task force shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the task force in accordance with Amendment 871 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901. These payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the state Comptroller on the State Treasury.
