to attend Morris College in Sumter, South Carolina, where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Education; he taught Political Science in Sumter and Greenville, South Carolina, for several years before pursuing further education at Ohio State University, where he earned the Doctor of Philosophy Degree; and

7 WHEREAS, with a passion for encouraging youth to 8 pursue a purpose-driven life, he entered the field of 9 counseling and became the Department Head of Psychology and 10 Guidance at Alabama A and M University in Normal, Alabama; 11 later, he served as a high school counselor in the Fulton 12 County Public School System in Georgia before returning to 13 Huntsville; and

WHEREAS, an advocate for equality, Dr. Hall 14 15 participated in sit-ins, marches, and demonstrations during 16 the Civil Rights Era; during this time, he met the love of his 17 life, fellow activist, Laura Vandiver; in 1973, the highly 18 regarded couple moved to Huntsville, where they continued 19 their teaching careers and became active members of St. Joseph 20 Catholic Church; they continued their unwavering commitment to 21 obtaining justice and equality for all, a path which led to 22 Laura Hall's election as State Representative for District 19; 23 and

WHEREAS, Dr. Hall was a member of numerous
organizations including Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity,
Incorporated, One Hundred Black Men of America, Alabama
Democratic Conference, the Alabama New South Coalition, the
