10	WHEREAS, Alabama families have had considerable

24	does not pick winners and losers; now therefore,
25	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE LEGISLATURE OF
26	ALABAMA, That the Interim Senate Tax Relief Committee is
27	created. The committee shall be composed of the President Pro

Tempore of the Senate and seven senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate. The chair of the committee shall be the President Pro Tempore and vice chair of the committee shall be elected at the first meeting by the members of the committee. The committee shall study all facets of the current tax system in the state.

Upon the request of the chair, the Secretary of the Senate shall provide necessary clerical assistance for the work of the committee. The committee shall meet monthly commencing September 2016, and shall report its findings, conclusions, and recommendations to the Legislature not later than the fifth legislative day of the 2017 Regular Session, whereupon the committee shall stand dissolved and discharged of any further duties and liabilities. Each member of the committee shall be entitled to his or her regular legislative compensation, his or her per diem, and travel expenses for each day he or she attends a meeting of the committee. Upon requisitions signed by the chair of the committee, these payments shall be paid out of any funds appropriated to the use of the Legislature by means of warrants drawn by the Comptroller on the State Treasury. Notwithstanding the foregoing, no member shall receive additional legislative compensation or per diem when the Legislature is in session or if a member is being paid any other payments on the same dates for attendance on other state business.
