25	Section 1. (a) A law enforcement officer,

27	request or require any victim of an alleged sexual offense to

submit to a polygraph examination or other truth-telling
 device as a condition of proceeding with the investigation of
 the offense.

4 (b) The refusal of a victim to submit to a polygraph
5 examination may not prevent the investigation, charging,
6 prosecution, trial, or sentencing of an alleged sexual
7 offense.

8 (c) For the purposes of this section, "sexual 9 offense" is an offense included in Section 15-20A-5, Code of 10 Alabama 1975.

11 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the 12 first day of the third month following its passage and 13 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
