19	AN ACT
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21	To amend Section 36-25A-2, Code of Alabama 1975, as
22	amended by Act 2015-340, 2015 Regular Session, relating to the
23	defined term "serial meeting" for purposes of the Alabama Open
24	Meetings Act; to exclude boards of trustees of institutions of
25	higher education created by statute.
26	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 36-25A-2, Code of Alabama 1975,
 as amended by Act 2015-340, 2015 Regular Session, is amended
 to read as follows:

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"§36-25A-2.

5 "As used in and for determining the applicability of
6 this chapter, the following words shall have the following
7 meanings solely for the purposes of this chapter:

"(1) DELIBERATION. An exchange of information or 8 ideas among a quorum of members of a subcommittee, committee, 9 10 or full governmental body intended to arrive at or influence a 11 decision as to how any members of the subcommittee, committee, 12 or full governmental body should vote on a specific matter that, at the time of the exchange, the participating members 13 expect to come before the subcommittee, committee, or full 14 15 body immediately following the discussion or at a later time.

16 "(2) EXECUTIVE SESSION. That portion of a meeting of 17 a subcommittee, committee, or full governmental body from 18 which the public is excluded for one or more of the reasons 19 prescribed in Section 36-25A-7(a).

"(3) GENERAL REPUTATION AND CHARACTER.
Characteristics or actions of a person directly involving good
or bad ethical conduct, moral turpitude, or suspected criminal
activity, not including job performance.

"(4) GOVERNMENTAL BODY. All boards, bodies, and
commissions of the executive and legislative departments of
the state or its political subdivisions or municipalities
which expend or appropriate public funds; all multimember

governing bodies of departments, agencies, institutions, and 1 2 instrumentalities of the executive and legislative departments 3 of the state or its political subdivisions or municipalities, including, without limitation, all corporations and other 4 5 instrumentalities whose governing boards are comprised of a majority of members who are appointed or elected by the state 6 or its political subdivisions, counties, or municipalities; 7 all quasi-judicial bodies of the executive and legislative 8 departments of the state; and all standing, special, or 9 10 advisory committees or subcommittees of, or appointed by, the 11 body. The term "governmental body" does not include any of the 12 following:

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"a. Legislative party caucuses or coalitions.

14 "b. Alabama appellate or trial courts, except as
15 required by the constitution of this state or any body
16 governed by rules of the Alabama Supreme Court.

17 "c. Voluntary membership associations comprised of 18 public employees, retirees, counties, municipalities, or their 19 instrumentalities which have not been delegated any 20 legislative or executive functions by the Legislature or 21 Governor.

"(5) JOB PERFORMANCE. The observed conduct or actions of a public employee or public official while on the job in furtherance of his or her assigned duties. Job performance includes whether a person is meeting, exceeding, or failing to meet job requirements or whether formal employment actions should be taken by the governmental body. Job performance does not include the general reputation and
 character of the person being discussed.

3 "(6) MEETING. a. Subject to the limitations herein,
4 the term meeting shall only apply to the following:

5 "1. The prearranged gathering of a quorum of a 6 governmental body or a quorum of a committee or subcommittee 7 of a governmental body at a time and place which is set by law 8 or operation of law.

9 "2. The prearranged gathering of a quorum of a 10 governmental body or a quorum of a committee or subcommittee 11 of a governmental body during which the full governmental 12 body, committee, or subcommittee of the governmental body is 13 authorized, either by law or otherwise, to exercise the powers 14 which it possesses or approve the expenditure of public funds.

15 "3. The gathering, whether or not it was 16 prearranged, of a quorum of a governmental body during which 17 the members of the governmental body deliberate specific 18 matters that, at the time of the exchange, the participating 19 members expect to come before the full governmental body at a 13 later date.

"4. The gathering, whether or not it was
prearranged, of a quorum of a committee or subcommittee of a
governmental body during which the members of the committee or
subcommittee deliberate specific matters relating to the
purpose of the committee or subcommittee that, at the time of
the exchange, the participating members expect to come before

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1 the full governmental body, committee, or subcommittee at a 2 later date.

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"b. The term "meeting" shall not include:

4 "1. Occasions when a quorum of a governmental body, committee, or subcommittee attends social gatherings, 5 conventions, conferences, training programs, press 6 7 conferences, media events, association meetings and events or gathers for on-site inspections or meetings with applicants 8 for economic incentives or assistance from the governmental 9 10 body, or otherwise gathers so long as the subcommittee, 11 committee, or full governmental body does not deliberate 12 specific matters that, at the time of the exchange, the 13 participating members expect to come before the subcommittee, 14 committee, or full governmental body at a later date.

15 "2. Occasions when a quorum of a subcommittee, 16 committee, or full governmental body gathers, in person or by 17 electronic communication, with state or federal officials for 18 the purpose of reporting or obtaining information or seeking 19 support for issues of importance to the subcommittee, 20 committee, or full governmental body.

"3. Notwithstanding subparagraph 1., occasions when two members of a governmental body, including two members of a governmental body which has three members, gather for the sole purpose of exchanging background and education information or for the sole purpose of discussing an economic, industrial, or commercial prospect or incentive that does not include a conclusion as to recommendations, policy, decision, or final 1 action on the terms or request or an offer of public financial 2 resources.

"c. Nothing herein shall restrict or prevent two 3 4 members of the same full governmental body from talking 5 together without deliberation, including two members of a full governmental body having only three members, and nothing 6 7 herein shall restrict or prevent a mayor or executive director of a city or municipality who is not a voting member of the 8 city or municipal council from talking or deliberating with a 9 10 member of the city or municipal council.

11 "(7) OPEN OR PUBLIC PORTION OF A MEETING. The open 12 or public portion of a meeting is that portion which has not 13 been closed for executive session in accordance with this chapter, for which prior notice was given in compliance with 14 this chapter, and which is conducted so that constituents of 15 16 the governmental body, members of the media, persons 17 interested in the activities of the governmental body, and 18 citizens of this state could, if they desired, attend and 19 observe.

20 "(8) PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCE. The ability of an 21 individual to practice a profession within the profession's 22 acceptable standards of care and responsibility. A profession 23 is a vocation requiring certification by the State of Alabama 24 or passage of a state licensing examination that may only be 25 granted to or taken by persons who have completed at least 26 three years of college-level education and obtained at least a 27 college-level degree.

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"(9) PUBLIC EMPLOYEE. Any person employed at the 1 2 state, county, or municipal levels of government or their 3 instrumentalities, including governmental corporations and authorities, who is paid in whole or in part from state, 4 5 county, or municipal funds. A public employee does not include a person employed on a part-time basis whose employment is 6 7 limited to providing professional services other than 8 lobbying, the compensation for which constitutes less than 50 percent of the part-time employee's income. 9

10 "(10) PUBLIC FUNDS. Taxes or fees charged or 11 collected by a governmental body or from the sale of public 12 property including, but not limited to, matching funds from 13 the federal government or income derived from the investment 14 of taxes or fees.

"(11) PUBLIC OFFICIAL. Any person elected to public office, whether or not that person has taken office, by the vote of the people at state, county, or municipal levels of government or their instrumentalities, including governmental corporations, and any person appointed to a position at the state, county, or municipal levels of government or their instrumentalities, including governmental corporations.

"(12) QUORUM. Unless otherwise provided by law, a quorum is a majority of the voting members of a governmental body. Except where a governmental body is prohibited from holding a non-emergency meeting as defined in subdivision (6)a.1. between the date of election of members and the date such members take office, any person elected to serve on a

governmental body shall be counted in the determination of 1 2 whether a quorum of that governmental body is present, except 3 for any meeting as defined in subdivisions (6)a.1. and 2., beginning on the date of certification of the results of the 4 5 general election. In the case of appointment to a governmental body, any person shall be counted in the determination of 6 7 whether a quorum of that governmental body is present, except 8 for any meeting as defined in subdivisions (6)a.1. and 2., from the date that the appointment is made or issued whether 9 10 or not the appointment is effective on that date.

"(13) SERIAL MEETING. a. The term serial meeting applies to any series of gatherings of two or more members of a governmental body, at which:

14 "1. Less than a quorum is present at each individual 15 gathering and each individual gathering is attended by at 16 least one member who also attends one or more other gatherings 17 in the series.

18 "2. The total number of members attending two or 19 more of the series of gatherings collectively constitutes a 20 quorum.

"3. There is no notice or opportunity to attendprovided to the public in accordance with this chapter.

"4. The members participating in the gatherings
deliberate specific matters that, at the time of the exchange,
the participating members expect to come before the
subcommittee, committee or full governmental body at a later
date.

- "5. The series of gatherings was held for the
 purpose of circumventing the provisions of this chapter.
- 3 "6. At least one of the meetings in the series
 4 occurs within seven calendar days of a vote on any of the
 5 matters deliberated.

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"b. The term serial meeting does not include:

7 "1. Gatherings, including a gathering of two members
8 of a full governmental body having only three members, at
9 which no deliberations were conducted or the sole purpose was
10 to exchange background and education information with members
11 on specific issues.

12 "2. A series of gatherings related to a search to 13 fill a position required to file a statement of economic 14 interests with the Alabama Ethics Commission pursuant to 15 Section 36-25-14 until the search has been narrowed to three 16 or fewer persons under consideration.

17 "3. A gathering or series of gatherings involving18 only a single member of a governmental body.

19 "4. A series of gatherings by the trustees of an 20 institution of higher education established by the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, or of any 21 22 statutorily created four-year institution of higher education 23 in the state, or of Athens State University involving a search 24 to fill a position that directs the institution or a 25 department or major divisions thereof, including the position 26 of president, vice president, provost, dean, department head, 27 or athletic coach.

"5. A meeting in which a public official who is a 1 2 member of a non-profit professional association comprised of members of the same profession, when discussing or 3 participating discusses or participates in the formation of 4 5 the policy or policies of the professional association of which the public official is a member. This exception shall 6 7 apply to both legislative policies of the professional 8 association and regulatory polices of the professional association of which the public official is a member, and 9 10 regardless of whether or not a quorum of the members of the 11 governmental body are members of the same professional association." 12

Section 2. This act shall become effective
immediately following its passage and approval by the
Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
