10 TO BE ENTITLED  
11 AN ACT

13 Relating to Calhoun County; authorizing the sale of  
14 alcoholic beverages in the city limits of the City of Piedmont  
15 and the police jurisdiction of the city each day of the week  
16 by properly licensed clubs and retail licensees of the  
17 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board; and to authorize the  
18 governing body of the city to regulate the sale of alcoholic  
19 beverages to the general public.

20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

21 Section 1. This act only applies in the City of  
22 Piedmont in Calhoun County and in the police jurisdiction of  
23 the city.

24 Section 2. Alcoholic beverages may be sold each day  
25 of the week for on-premises and off-premises consumption by  
26 licensed clubs and retail licensees of the Alcoholic Beverage

1 Control Board in the City of Piedmont and in the police  
2 jurisdiction of the city.

3 Section 3. The City Council of the City of Piedmont,  
4 by resolution or ordinance passed by a simple majority, may  
5 regulate, but may not prohibit, the sale of alcoholic  
6 beverages for both on-premises and off-premises consumption  
7 each day of the week by licensed clubs and retail licensees of  
8 the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to the general public.  
9 Licensed clubs and retail licensees granted a license may sell  
10 or dispense alcoholic beverages pursuant to the requirements  
11 of the license and applicable regulations of the board.

12 Section 4. The provisions of this act are cumulative  
13 and supplemental to the present power and authority of the  
14 City of Piedmont and are not intended to repeal any existing  
15 power or authority of the governing body now permitted under  
16 the general laws of the state or under any local or special  
17 act of the Legislature.

18 Section 5. This act shall become effective  
19 immediately following its passage and approval by the  
20 Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
