9	AND IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM TO PROMOTE ORGAN DONATION IN ALABAMA.

11	WHEREAS, there is an acute need for organ donors in
12	Alabama and throughout the nation; and
13	WHEREAS, according to the United Network for Organ
14	Sharing, more than 121,000 people are waiting for an organ
15	transplant nationally, and a new person is added to the
16	waiting list every 18 minutes; and
17	WHEREAS, in Alabama, more than 3,300 people are
18	waiting for an organ transplant; and
19	WHEREAS, for an average of 19 people per day, the
20	wait is too long and they die before a suitable organ is
21	available; and
22	WHEREAS, more can be done to provide greater
23	education and public awareness regarding the decision to
24	become an organ donor; and
25	WHEREAS, the story of Angelynn Luckadoo, a 14-year
26	old young girl with cystic fibrosis who received a double lung

1 and heart transplant, is a testament to the importance of 2 organ donation; Angelynn's transplant was made possible by 3 organ donations from recently deceased 26-year-old Courtney Harris that saved Angelynn's life; now therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we encourage the State 6 7 Department of Education to create and implement a program to promote organ donation within the public K-12 schools across 8 9 the state, including at voluntary school blood drives, and to 10 encourage local school systems to participate in the program. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this 11 12 resolution shall be sent to the State Superintendent of 13 Education.
