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8	RECOGNIZING NATIONAL FOSTER CARE MONTH.
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10	WHEREAS, National Foster Care Month was established
11	more than 20 years ago to bring foster care issues to the
12	forefront of public consciousness, to highlight the importance
13	of permanency for every child, and to recognize the essential
14	role that foster parents, social workers, and advocates have
15	in the lives of children in foster care throughout Alabama;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, all children deserve a safe, loving, and
18	permanent home; and
19	WHEREAS, the primary goal of the foster care system
20	is to ensure the safety and well-being of children while
21	working to provide a safe, loving, and permanent home for each
22	child; and
23	WHEREAS, approximately 5,000 children are living in
24	foster care in Alabama; and
25	WHEREAS, foster parents are the frontline caregivers
26	for children who cannot safely remain with their biological

1 parents; provide physical care, emotional support, and education advocacy to the children in their care; and are the largest single source of families providing permanent homes 3 for children transitioning from foster care to adoption; and WHEREAS, children in foster care who are placed with 5 6 relatives, compared to children placed with nonrelatives, have 7 more stability, including fewer changes in placements, have more positive perceptions of their placements, are more likely 8 to be placed with their siblings, and demonstrate fewer 9 10 behavioral problems; and WHEREAS, some relative caregivers receive less 11 12 financial assistance and support services than foster 13 caregivers; and 14 WHEREAS, the number of youth who age out of foster care has increased during the past decade; and 15 16 WHEREAS, foster care is intended to be a temporary 17 placement, but children remain in the foster care system for an average of two years; and 18 WHEREAS, children in foster care experience an 19 20 average of three different placements, which often lead to disruption of routines and the need to change schools and move 21 22 away from siblings, extended families, and familiar 23 surroundings; and WHEREAS, children entering foster care often 24 2.5 confront the widespread misperception that children in foster

care are disruptive, unruly, and dangerous, even though

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placement in foster care is based on the actions of a parent or guardian, not the child; and

WHEREAS, children who age out of foster care lack the security and support of a biological or adoptive family and frequently struggle to secure affordable housing, obtain health insurance, pursue higher education, and acquire adequate employment; and

WHEREAS, states, localities, and communities should be encouraged to invest resources in preventive and reunification services and post-permanency programs to ensure that more children in foster care are provided with safe, loving, and permanent placements; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize May 2016 as National Foster Care Month to provide an opportunity to acknowledge the accomplishments of the child welfare workforce, foster parents, the advocacy community, and mentors for their dedication, accomplishments, and positive impact on the lives of children; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That in recognition of the importance of foster care in Alabama, we recognize May 2016 as National Foster Care Month.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the House of Representatives and the Secretary of the Senate are authorized and directed to transmit copies of this resolution
