9 OF THE AUTAUGA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

11 WHEREAS, we deeply regret and are greatly saddened  
12 to learn of the death of Sergeant William Troy Seamon of the  
13 Autauga County Sheriff's Office on April 4, 2016, at 41 years  
14 of age; and

15 WHEREAS, the passing of Sergeant Troy Seamon leaves  
16 a void in the lives of his loving family, many friends, and  
17 the entire community, where he was highly regarded; and

18 WHEREAS, Sergeant Seamon earned immense respect for  
19 his tireless dedication and exceptional abilities while  
20 honorably serving the community as a deputy for the Autauga  
21 County Sheriff's Office for 18 years; and

22 WHEREAS, his computer skills were an invaluable  
23 asset to the Autauga County Sheriff's Office, where he took  
24 care of all the information technology needs and wrote grant  
25 applications, among his many responsibilities; he also handled  
26 the registration of sex offenders in the county; and

1           WHEREAS, in addition to serving with the Autauga  
2 County Sheriff's Office, Sergeant Seamon nobly safeguarded  
3 lives and homes as a member of the Pine Level Volunteer Fire  
4 Department; over the course of his career, Sergeant Seamon had  
5 also served as an EMT and dispatcher with City Ambulance of  
6 Alabama and a dispatcher for the City of Montgomery; and

7           WHEREAS, Sergeant Seamon is remembered for his dry  
8 wit and quirky sense of humor; with a cool demeanor, he would  
9 make quips, and, at times, it was hard to determine if he was  
10 being serious or joking; and

11           WHEREAS, survivors include his parents, Sonny and  
12 Vickie Seamon; one sister, Allison Adams (Steve); maternal  
13 grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. C.W. Simpson; great-grandmother,  
14 Ella Ree Wiles; and numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, extended  
15 family members, and friends; he was preceded in death by  
16 paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Morris E. Seamon; and

17           WHEREAS, Sergeant William Troy Seamon was a valued  
18 member of the community; although his presence is greatly  
19 missed, his loving memory, which is all the more cherished for  
20 having been brief, lives on in the hearts and minds of all
