Marshall on 13 March 23, 2016, at the age of 65; born in Massachusetts, 14 Marshall had lived in the Montgomery area since he was a 15 teenager; he was a long-time member of Snowdoun United 16 Methodist Church; and 17 WHEREAS, after graduating from Lanier High School, 18 Marshall served eight years in the United States Army before 19 joining the Montgomery Police Department in 1978 and served in 20 various roles in the department for 20 years; while with that department, Marshall was named Police Officer of the Year in 21 1985; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Marshall was elected as the 35th Sheriff of 24 Montgomery, Alabama, in 1998 and served four terms before 25 retiring in 2015; he dedicated his entire public service career to protecting the citizens of Montgomery; he never 26

became complacent nor lost his focus in his distinguished
 career in law enforcement for over 35 years; and

3 WHEREAS, for his years of unselfish contributions 4 and public service, the Montgomery County Training Facility 5 was named in his honor as the D.T. Marshall Firing Range and 6 Training Facility; and

7 WHEREAS, during his lifetime, Sheriff Marshall served in numerous volunteer and community leadership roles, 8 including with the Alabama Sheriff's Association, the National 9 10 Sheriff's Association, the Andrew Jackson Masonic Lodge, and 11 as a member of VOCAL, Victims of Crime and Leniency; and he 12 received numerous recognitions and awards but was most known for his dedicated and tireless service to the citizens he 13 loved: and 14

WHEREAS, D. T. Marshall was preceded in death by his 15 parents Rita Sherry Mendez and Huey Marshall Jr; and his wife, 16 17 Carolyn Marshall; left to cherish the endearing memories of D. T. Marshall are sisters, Elizabeth Wamhoff, Annie (Todd) 18 19 Pease, and Joyce Davis; brothers, Bobby Marshall and Huey 20 (Caryn) Marshall, III; caregiver and nephew, Timothy Bouchard; 21 great nieces, Alexia Pease and Ansley Bouchard; best friend 22 and fishing buddy Norman Mitchell, a host of other relatives, 23 special fellow officers, and friends; and

Marshall was a valued member of the 25 community and loved by many, we join with others to celebrate 26 his life and to mourn his death; although his presence will be 27 greatly missed, his memory will be cherished in the hearts and 1 minds of those who were fortunate to know him and all those
