WHEREAS, Mr. Belcher began his automotive career in Jacksonville, Florida, and moved his family to Huntsville, Alabama, before purchasing Royal Oldsmobile Company in Vestavia in 1974; he served in leadership roles in local, state, and national automotive organizations; he served his community as a member of the Vestavia City Council, President of the Vestavia Hills Board of Education, and as a member of numerous clubs and organizations; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Belcher was recognized by The Vestavia Rotary Club as a Paul Harris Fellow and received the Lifetime Achievement Award from Leadership Vestavia Hills; he was a major supporter of Auburn University and The University of Alabama and was extremely active in Auburn's Fellowship of Christian Athletes and co-founder of the Birmingham fund raising efforts; in addition, he was a supporter and board member of the John Croyle's Big Oak Boys' and Girls' Ranches; he recently completed an eight-year appointment as a Trustee for Samford University, and was elected to another term prior to his passing; he was a faithful and devoted member of Shades Mountain Baptist Church, where he served as Deacon and Chair of the Finance Committee; and
