BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That April 2016 is recognized as Metastatic Breast Cancer Awareness Month in Alabama, and we and urge all citizens to spread awareness of this heart wrenching disease, provide support for those affected by this illness, and educate others on its prevention and early detection.
