| 14 | his death, we celebrate his remarkable life; Mr. Tate's father |
| 15 | taught him to play the game of Chess and throughout his |
| 16 | lifetime, Mr. Tate excelled at the game and became an |
| 17 | International Chess Master; he is internationally renown as |

| 20 | WHEREAS, following graduation from Concord High |
| 21 | School in Elkhart, Indiana, Mr. Tate attended Northwestern |
| 22 | University and later joined the United States Air Force; Tate |
| 23 | won the U.S. Armed Forces Chess Championships in 1983 as a |
| 24 | Senior Airman, in 1984 as Sergeant, and in 1987, 1988, and |
| 25 | 1989 as Staff Sergeant; and |
| 26 | WHEREAS, becoming a folk hero, Tate dazzled |
| 27 | thousands with his tactical treats and developed an Internet |

fan base; Tate enjoyed the performance of his games and over the years, Tate became a master-level player and showed his games to the general public; and

WHEREAS, an intellectually brilliant man, Tate recited poetry, played the piano, sang, spoke foreign languages, and was a remarkable chess instructor; he traveled the world sharing his craft and passion; and

WHEREAS, Tate was inducted into the Indiana Hall of Fame in 2005 and was a six-time champion in Indiana, winning in 1995, 1996, 2000, 2005, 2006, and 2007; he was the 2010 Alabama State Champion; although he won numerous titles and made generous contributions to chess, he was never awarded the Grandmaster title; and

WHEREAS, a valued member of the community, Emory

Tate, Jr., combined his character, integrity, and

sportsmanship to inspire countless others; with utmost

reverence and respect, we uplift his life and legacy, which

has reflected immense credit upon the entire State of Alabama;

now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That while celebrating the life and legacy of Emory Tate, Jr., we are extremely grateful for his abundant life, and we offer this resolution in highest tribute to his inspiring life and legacy, as well as in heartfelt sympathy to his family and friends.
