9	WITH MENTAL ILLNESSES IN JAILS.

11	WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment
12	services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental
13	illnesses booked into jail each year; and
14	WHEREAS, prevalence rates of serious mental
15	illnesses in jails are three to six times higher than for the
16	general public; and
17	WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with
18	serious mental illnesses in jails have co-occurring substance
19	use disorders; and
20	WHEREAS, adults with mental illnesses tend to stay
21	longer in jail and, upon release, are at a higher risk of
22	recidivism than people without these disorders; and
23	WHEREAS, county jails spend two to three times more
24	on adults with mental illnesses that require interventions
25	compared to those without these treatment needs; and
26	WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and
27	services, people with mental illnesses continue to cycle

through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families; and

WHEREAS, all counties throughout the State can take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Alabama has passed legislation, created committees and task forces to assist with the Prison Reform effort; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Alabama encourages county partnerships in Alabama through the Stepping Up initiative, the National Association of Counties, the Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation who are all encouraging public, private, and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we do hereby encourage the counties throughout Alabama to sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in our county jail, commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in the state and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials, employees, and residents to participate in the Stepping Up Initiative.
