BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That we hereby urge Alabama's federal elected officials in Washington, D.C., including President Barack Obama, U.S. Senators, Richard Shelby and Jeff Sessions, and members of the U.S. House of Representatives to continue to fight for strong enforcement of our nation's trade laws to level the playing field with China and other countries, and taking whatever action necessary to protect the domestic steel industry from unfair foreign competition.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we urge the United States Department of Commerce to maintain China's "non-market economy" status, which preserves the ability of U.S. companies and American workers to access domestic trade remedy laws.
