19	To make appropriations for the ordinary expenses of
20	the executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the
21	State, for other functions of government, for debt service,
22	and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September
23	30, 2018.
24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
25	Section 1. The monies in Section 2 are appropriated
26	from the named funds for the 2018 fiscal year to the state
27	agencies indicated, as the amounts to be used to pay the

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expenditures of the named agencies, and are in lieu of all monies appropriated for these purposes in other sections of the Alabama Statutes.

For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the following definitions shall be applicable.

10 "Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total11 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

17 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 18 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 19 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 20 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 21 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

25 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
26 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
27 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

Section 2. There is hereby appropriated the amounts 1 2 set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the executive, 3 legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital 4 5 outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such other 6 funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much thereof as 7 8 may be necessary, and the total amount to be expended for the 9 items for which the appropriation is herein made shall not 10 exceed the amount provided therefor, except as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 41-19-1 through 11 12 41-19-12, Code of Alabama 1975. Provided, however, that re-13 gardless of the ending date of any pay period which has been or may be established by the Legislature for the payment of 14 salaries of state employees, the entire payment due shall be 15 made from the fiscal year's appropriation in which the pay 16 17 date falls.

There is further appropriated to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, after provision has been made for the other expenditures herein authorized, such sums as are or may be necessary to purchase the alcoholic beverages which are essential to maintain adequate stocks and inventory for an economic and successful sales operation. In addition to the above appropriation, it is further provided that, in the event any county or municipality of the state shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, authorize the legal sale of malt and brewed beverages within such county or municipality there is further appropriated, in addition to the amount herein set out, an amount comparable to that expended during the prior fiscal year for beer and license tax supervision within counties or municipalities of similar size and population. Provided further, that the amount appropriated herein shall be reduced in like manner in the event any county or municipality wherein malt and brewed beverages are now authorized by law to be sold shall, during the fiscal period covered by this appropriation by proper referendum, declare unlawful the sale in such county or municipality of such malt or brewed beverages. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations 7 8 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 9 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or 10 litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018. The 11 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 12 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the 13 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate 14 15 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval 16 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through 17 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of 18 Alabama 1975. 19

Section 6. Except as may be herein otherwise 20 21 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 22 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 23 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the 24 maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 25 26 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 27 herein except as may be further provided for under this act,

1 as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 2 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those 3 appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 4 5 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80 et 6 7 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 8 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

9 Section 7. Any surplus remaining in any 10 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 11 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 12 13 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 14 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 15 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 16 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

17 Section 8. In addition to appropriations herein made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or 18 entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 19 20 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 21 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, 22 board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 23 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, 24 in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 25 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 26 27 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall

be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational 1 2 entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 3 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 4 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 5 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 6 7 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of 8 Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975. 9

10 Section 9. The Department of Examiners of Public Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 11 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 12 13 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 14 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 15 16 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts 17 to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama 18 1975. 19

20 Section 10. Upon certification to the Director of 21 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has 22 ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 23 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby 24 appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 25 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 26 27 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are

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in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter
made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are
conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination
by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are
not available for the court-ordered payments.

Section 11. All interest earned from funds paid into 6 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 7 8 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 9 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of 10 the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 11 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 12 13 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 14 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

Section 12. All encumbered balances of a previous 15 16 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions 17 authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal 18 year immediately following the fiscal year for which the 19 20 appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the 21 State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the 22 appropriation or appropriations were made.

23 Section 13. The appropriations made herein to the 24 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 25 the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 26 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 27 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in this act and receiving services from other governmental agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for such services.

6 Section 14. All funds collected under Section 7 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and 8 September 30, 2017 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn 9 University Center for Governmental Services for the 10 administration of the examiner certification program 11 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 12 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

13 Section 15. It is the intent of the Legislature that 14 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President Pro Tempore in subsection 8 of Section 2A of this act which 15 16 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate 17 President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code 18 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of 19 20 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama 1975. 21

22 Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the 23 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include 24 the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 25 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 26 ending September 30, 2018. In addition to the amounts 27 otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby

1 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same 2 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and 3 employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts 4 5 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall not exceed \$9,600,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 6 2018. The Director of Finance shall ensure that first priority 7 8 shall be given to all General Fund payrolls, including the 9 payroll of the Legislature. State agencies may receive 10 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this 11 section from the General Fund in amounts necessary to pay for the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from the 12 13 State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance 14 to those agencies which receive transfers from the State 15 General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance program 16 wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed 17 rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 18 retired members. 19

Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of any type, including contracting, of any of the funds appropriated in this act. Section 18. If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

8 Section 19. All laws or parts of laws, general, 9 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 10 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 11 expressly repealed.

Section 20. Each agency of the state funded through the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of this state without regard to sex or race.

Section 21. This act shall become effective October 17 1, 2017.
