8	SYNOPSIS:	Currently, there is no specific license of
9		the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board relating to
10		direct shipping of limited quantities of wine to
11		Alabama residents for their personal use.
12		This bill would allow a currently licensed
13		wine producer, supplier, importer, wholesaler,
14		distributor, or retailer to obtain a wine direct
15		shipper license from the Alcoholic Beverage Control
16		Board to allow the licensee to ship limited
17		quantities of wine directly to Alabama residents
18		for their personal use, under certain
19		circumstances.
20		A violation of the requirements of this bill
21		would constitute a Class C misdemeanor.
22		This bill would also authorize small package
23		delivery carriers to deliver wine to residents and
24		alcoholic beverages to the Alcoholic Beverage
25		Control Board and certain licensees without

carrying a bill of lading, consignment, or other document other than a package shipping label.

Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, prohibits a general law whose purpose or effect would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds from becoming effective with regard to a local governmental entity without enactment by a 2/3 vote unless: it comes within one of a number of specified exceptions; it is approved by the affected entity; or the Legislature appropriates funds, or provides a local source of revenue, to the entity for the purpose.

The purpose or effect of this bill would be to require a new or increased expenditure of local funds within the meaning of the amendment. However, the bill does not require approval of a local governmental entity or enactment by a 2/3 vote to become effective because it comes within one of the specified exceptions contained in the amendment.

2 To provide for a wine direct shipper license; to amend Section 28-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975; to allow the 3 licensee to ship a limited amount of wine directly to an Alabama resident who is 21 years of age or older for personal 5 use only; to provide the licensing procedure; to provide 6 7 restrictions and requirements on the direct shipment of wine; to provide for issuance and renewal fees for the wine direct 8 9 shipper license; to provide that an unlicensed direct shipment of wine constitutes a Class C misdemeanor; to authorize small 10 11 package delivery carriers to deliver wine to residents and 12 alcoholic beverages to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board 13 and certain licensees without carrying a bill of lading, 14 consignment, or other document other than a package shipping 15 label; and in connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of 16 17 local funds within the meaning of Amendment 621 of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, now appearing as Section 18 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of 19 Alabama of 1901, as amended. 20

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

Section 1. Section 28-1-4, Code of Alabama 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"\$28-1-4.

"(a) The words and phrases used in this section shall have the meanings ascribed to them in Section 28-3-1 and

any acts amendatory thereof, supplementary thereto or substituted therefor.

"(b) It shall be unlawful for common or permit carriers, operators of trucks, buses or other conveyances or out-of-state manufacturers or suppliers to make delivery of any alcoholic beverage from without the State of Alabama to any person, association or corporation within the state, except to the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board and to manufacturers, importers, wholesalers and warehouses licensed by the Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to receive the alcoholic beverages so delivered; provided, however, wine may be shipped to a resident who is at least 21 years of age in the state at the direction of a wine direct shipper licensee in accordance with Section 2 of the act adding this amendatory language.

"(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b), small package delivery carriers may transport and deliver shipments of wine to a resident at the direction of a wine direct shipper license and may transport and deliver alcoholic beverages to the board and to manufacturers, importers, wholesalers, and warehouses licensed by the board. These small package delivery carriers are not required to maintain in the vehicle or within the possession of the driver of the vehicle a bill of lading, consignment, or any other documentary evidence of any portion of the cargo being transported other than information available on the package shipping label.

- (2) Shall ensure that all containers of wine shipped directly to a resident in this state are conspicuously labeled with the words: "CONTAINS ALCOHOL: SIGNATURE OF PERSON AGE 21 OR OLDER REQUIRED FOR DELIVERY."
 - (3) If located outside of this state, shall report to the board annually the total amount of wine shipped into the state the preceding calendar year.
 - (4) Whether located within or outside of this state, collect and properly remit all state and local sales or use taxes and excise taxes due on sales to Alabama residents.
 - (5) If located within this state, shall provide the Department of Revenue any additional information deemed necessary beyond that already required for retail sales from the winery tasting room to ensure compliance with this section.
 - (6) Shall permit the board or the Department of Revenue to perform an audit of the wine direct shipper licensees records upon request.
 - (7) Shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the board or any other state law enforcement agency and the Alabama courts concerning enforcement of this section and any related laws or administrative rules.
 - (d) A wine direct shipper licensee may renew its license with the board by paying a fifty dollar (\$50) renewal

- fee annually and providing the board a true copy of its

 current alcoholic beverage license issued in this or any other

 state.
 - (e) The board and the Department of Revenue may jointly promulgate rules pursuant to the Alabama

 Administrative Procedure Act to implement this section.

- (f) The board may enforce the requirements of this section by administrative proceedings to suspend or revoke a wine direct shipper license, and the board may accept payment of an offer in compromise in lieu of suspension, such payments to be determined by rule promulgated by the board.
- (g) Shipments of wine direct to consumers in Alabama from persons who do not possess a current wine direct shipper license from the board are prohibited and any person who knowingly makes, participates in, transports, imports, or receives such a shipment is guilty of a Class C misdemeanor.

Section 3. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Amendment 621, now appearing as Section 111.05 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama of 1901, as amended, because the bill defines a new crime or amends the definition of an existing crime.

Section 4. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
