9	TRAINING COMMISSION TO OFFER MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS TRAINING.

11	WHEREAS, there exists a mental health crisis in
12	America and more specifically in Alabama; and
13	WHEREAS, law enforcement officers are called upon to
14	respond to or encounter situations involving persons
15	displaying behaviors consistent with mental illness or crisis;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, effective ways to mitigate an encounter
18	between law enforcement and a person living with a mental
19	illness include recognition of the signs and symptoms of
20	mental illness, safe de-escalation and timely referral to
21	mental health services; and
22	WHEREAS, mental health awareness training provides
23	law enforcement officers with initial effective response
24	options; and
25	WHEREAS, the Alabama Peace Officers Standards and
26	Training Commission (APOSTC) provides mandatory training of
27	all certified law enforcement officers in Alahama: and

WHEREAS, APOSTC develops and implements the training curriculum for all law enforcement officers in the basic training academy; and

WHEREAS, the APOSTC leadership recognizes the value of additional mental health awareness training at the academy and has recognized the effectiveness of Crisis Intervention

Team (CIT) training programs for advanced training; and

WHEREAS, APOSTC has expressed a willingness to include mental health awareness training as a component of the training curriculum for all newly certified law enforcement officers as soon as is practical, and promote additional training for law enforcement officers in the field to include mental health awareness training and CIT programs to ensure the safety of all persons; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That APOSTC is congratulated on its willingness to recognize the importance and value of mental health awareness training and community-based CIT programs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That mental health awareness training shall commence at the academy at the earliest possible date as a component of the APOSTC basic academy training.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That all Alabama law enforcement agencies are encouraged to utilize mental health awareness training for certified law enforcement officers in Alabama as a part of in-service training or annual continuing education.

enforcement agencies are encouraged to work with their state and local mental health providers to develop and implement the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training concept within their jurisdictions to help de-escalate and resolve mental health crisis conflicts; and that, APOSTC encourages CIT training and refresher training as a mattern of continuing education for all law enforcement officers.
