Section 1. Section 13A-10-41, Code of Alabama 1975, 2 is amended to read as follows:

3 "\$13A-10-41.

"(a) A person commits the crime of resisting arrest if he <u>or she</u> intentionally prevents or attempts to prevent a <u>peace law enforcement</u> officer from affecting a lawful arrest of himself <u>or herself</u> or of another person <u>for a separate</u>, <u>unrelated crime</u>. A law enforcement officer may only arrest a <u>person for the crime of resisting arrest if the officer is concurrently arresting the person for a separate, unrelated crime</u>.

"(b) Resisting arrest is a Class B misdemeanor."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
