19	the Alabama Statutes.
20	For the purpose of this act, the amounts herein for
21	expenditures are listed by programmatic area and the totals
22	for all programs are shown by the source of funds. It is
23	intended that only the herein named funds be appropriated in
24	the amounts specified to the named agencies and that the
25	following definitions shall be applicable.
26	"Appropriation Total" shall mean the aggregate total

27 of all fund sources.

"Program" shall mean specific governmental services required to achieve a specific objective. A program shall be directed to meeting the need of an identified clientele, or group of recipients or beneficiaries, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

6 "Capital Outlay" shall mean expenditures which 7 result in the acquisition and/or addition to items, such as 8 land or buildings, which have an appreciable and calculable 9 period of usefulness in excess of one year, and shall be 10 expended only for such purposes.

"Debt Service" shall mean an expenditure for the payment of interest and principal on bonded debt obligations of the State, and shall be expended only for such purposes.

14 "Federal and Local Funds" shall mean all gifts,
15 grants, contributions, or entitlements, including grants by
16 the Congress of the United States, municipalities or counties.

17 Section 2. There is hereby appropriated 18 the amounts set forth herein for the ordinary expenses of the 19 executive, legislative, and judicial agencies of the State, 20 for other functions of government, for debt service, and for capital outlay for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, 21 22 to be paid out of any monies hereinafter specified, from such 23 other funds and accounts as may be designated, or so much 24 thereof as may be necessary, and the total amount to be ex-25 pended for the items for which the appropriation is herein 26 made shall not exceed the amount provided therefor, except as 27 provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections

2 Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provisions of 3 this act or any other act, any amounts from appropriations for 4 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017, to the various 5 state agencies in this act which were unexpended and reverted 6 on September 30, 2017, are hereby reappropriated to the 7 respective offices for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 8 2017.

9 Section 4. In addition to all other appropriations 10 heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby appropriated 11 such amounts as may be necessary for the fiscal year ending 12 September 30, 2018, to the Retirement Systems of Alabama from 13 the Senior Services Trust Fund to comply with Section 14 41-15C-1, Code of Alabama 1975.

15 Section 5. In addition to all other appropriations heretofore or hereafter made, there is hereby conditionally 16 17 appropriated any and all amounts from tobacco settlement or litigation for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018. The 18 amounts are conditioned upon the State of Alabama receiving 19 20 revenue from tobacco settlement or litigation and upon the 21 recommendation of the Director of Finance, the Chairs of the House Ways and Means General Fund Committee and the Senate 22 23 Finance and Taxation-General Fund Committee, and the approval 24 of the Governor. The conditional appropriation made herein

shall be allocated pursuant to Sections 41-10-620 through
 41-10-639 and Sections 41-15B-1 through 41-15B-8, Code of
 Alabama 1975.

Section 6. Except as may be herein otherwise 4 provided, amounts herein specifically appropriated shall be in 5 lieu of the amounts heretofore provided or appropriated by law 6 7 for such purposes. The amounts herein appropriated are the maximum amounts to be expended for the purposes herein 8 designated and in no event shall the maximum expenditure 9 10 provided for any items of expense exceed the amount allocated 11 herein except as may be further provided for under this act, 12 as provided in the Budget Management Act of 1976, Sections 13 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and those appropriations herein made, except appropriations to the 14 15 Alabama Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the purchase of 16 alcoholic beverages, are and shall be subject to the terms, 17 conditions, provisions and limitations of Sections 41-4-80 et 18 seq., Code of Alabama 1975, and the Budget Management Act of 19 1976, Sections 41-19-1 et seq., Code of Alabama 1975.

20 Section 7. Any surplus remaining in any appropriation herein made from the State General Fund to any 21 22 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency may be 23 transferred, on order of the Governor, to any other 24 appropriation herein made from the State General Fund when 25 such appropriation to any office, department, bureau, board, 26 commission or agency is insufficient to pay salaries in that 27 office, department, bureau, board, commission or agency.

1 Section 8. In addition to appropriations herein 2 made, all gifts, grants, insurance proceeds, contributions or entitlements, in excess of the amount carried in this act, 3 4 including grants by the Congress of the United States, 5 municipalities or counties, to any department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, institution, office or 6 7 officer of the State of Alabama are hereby appropriated and, in the event the same are recurring, are reappropriated to 8 such department, division, board, bureau, commission, agency, 9 10 institution, office or officer to be used only for the purpose 11 or purposes for which the grant or contribution was or shall 12 be made. Further, all state, county, municipal and educational entities are authorized to disburse such sums as deemed 13 necessary by mutual agreement between said entities and the 14 State of Alabama, Department of Examiners of Public Accounts 15 16 to partially defray the cost of auditing services performed by 17 said agency. All such sums are hereby appropriated and 18 reappropriated if necessary to the Department of Examiners of 19 Public Accounts for audit services, to be expended through the 20 fund established by Section 41-5-24, Code of Alabama 1975.

21 Section 9. The Department of Examiners of Public 22 Accounts is hereby authorized to examine as deemed necessary 23 all appropriations herein made for compliance with the laws of 24 the State of Alabama. Any examination performed shall be in 25 accordance with the provisions of Title 41, Chapter 5, Code of 26 Alabama 1975. It is the intent of the Legislature that all 27 state agencies cooperate with the Examiners of Public Accounts to provide the information necessary to conduct recovery
 audits as provided for in Section 41-5-6.1, Code of Alabama
 1975.

Section 10. Upon certification to the Director of 4 5 Finance by the State Attorney General that a federal court has ordered the State of Alabama to pay claims, attorney fees, or 6 7 other costs relating to said court order, funds are hereby appropriated to the affected department, board, bureau, or 8 commission from the appropriate fund or funds of such 9 department, board, bureau or commission in the amount 10 11 necessary to satisfy that court order. Such appropriations are 12 in addition to any other appropriation heretofore or hereafter 13 made in this appropriation act. Such appropriations are conditioned upon the availability of funds and a determination 14 15 by the Director of Finance that existing appropriations are not available for the court-ordered payments. 16

17 Section 11. All interest earned from funds paid into 18 Account No. 0396 by Act 87-761, Act 88-947, Act 89-79, Act 19 90-556 and Act 91-572 are hereby appropriated to the 20 Governor's Contingency Fund to be spent at the discretion of the Governor. Any other interest earned by the state from 21 22 Revenue Sharing Investments under the State and Local Fiscal 23 Assistance Act of 1972, as amended, Public Law 92-512, 92nd 24 Congress, together with any accruals or reversions thereon are 25 hereby appropriated to the State General Fund.

26 Section 12. All encumbered balances of a previous 27 fiscal year appropriation, other than the exclusions authorized by this Act or in Section 41-4-93, Code of Alabama 1975, shall lapse no later than September 30 of the fiscal year immediately following the fiscal year for which the appropriation was made and shall revert to the credit of the State General Fund or earmarked fund from which the appropriation or appropriations were made.

7 Section 13. The appropriations made herein to the 8 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary, and said departments, boards, offices, 9 10 commissions and agencies are hereby directed to make the 11 transfer of funds to the State Personnel Department in said 12 amounts enumerated in this act. All agencies enumerated in 13 this act and receiving services from other governmental 14 agencies enumerated in this act shall make full payment in a 15 timely manner (as determined by the Department of Finance) for 16 such services.

17 Section 14. All funds collected under Section 18 40-12-43.1 between the effective date of Act 98-191 and 19 September 30, 2017 are hereby appropriated to the Auburn 20 University Center for Governmental Services for the 21 administration of the examiner certification program 22 established by the Alabama Local Tax Institute of Standards 23 and Training as provided in Section 40-12-43.1.

24 Section 15. It is the intent of the Legislature that 25 the funds appropriated to the Office of the Senate President 26 Pro Tempore in subsection 8 of Section 2A of this act which 27 are not otherwise designated may be expended by the Senate President Pro Tempore for the same purposes as are authorized
 for the Lieutenant Governor pursuant to Section 29-4-50, Code
 of Alabama 1975, and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives pursuant to Section 29-4-60, Code of Alabama
 1975.

Section 16. The appropriations made herein to the 6 7 departments, boards, offices, commissions and agencies include the amounts necessary to pay the SEIB. The SEIB rate shall be 8 \$930 per month for each full-time employee for the fiscal year 9 10 ending September 30, 2018. In addition to the amounts 11 otherwise appropriated in this act, there is hereby 12 appropriated from the State General Fund in the same 13 proportion as the salaries of the several State officials and employees are paid, additional amounts to pay for the increase 14 15 in employer contributions to SEIB. The additional amounts 16 appropriated in this section from the State General Fund shall 17 not exceed \$9,600,000 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 18 2018. The Director of Finance shall ensure that first priority 19 shall be given to all General Fund payrolls, including the 20 payroll of the Legislature. State agencies may receive 21 additional allocations from the appropriation made in this 22 section from the General Fund in amounts necessary to pay for 23 the increase. The remainder of this appropriation from the 24 State General Fund may be allotted by the Director of Finance 25 to those agencies which receive transfers from the State 26 General Fund. The SEIB shall adjust the insurance program 27 wherever appropriate to maintain the aforementioned fixed

1 rate; however, it is the intent of the Legislature that the 2 Board not increase the out of pocket costs to active and 3 retired members.

4 Section 17. It is the intent of the Legislature that 5 the Director of Finance shall notify the Chair of the House 6 Ways and Means General Fund Committee, the Chair of the Senate 7 Finance and Taxation General Fund Committee, and the 8 Legislative Fiscal Officer of any interagency transfers, of 9 any type, including contracting, of any of the funds 10 appropriated in this act.

11 Section 18. If any section, paragraph, sentence, 12 clause, provision or portion of this act or all or any portion 13 of any appropriations herein made be held unconstitutional or 14 invalid, it shall not affect any other section, paragraph, 15 sentence, clause, provision or portion of this act or any 16 other appropriation or appropriations or portion thereof 17 hereby made not in and of itself unconstitutional or invalid.

18 Section 19. All laws or parts of laws, general, 19 special, private or local that are in conflict with or 20 inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby 21 expressly repealed.

22 Section 20. Each agency of the state funded through 23 the provisions of this act shall provide an equal opportunity 24 for employment and business opportunities for all citizens of 25 this state without regard to sex or race.

26 Section 21. This act shall become effective October 27 1, 2017.
