3 (2) BARBERING. The occupation of shaving or trimming
4 the beard, cutting or dressing the hair, giving facial or
5 scalp massages, giving facial or scalp treatment with oils or
6 creams or other preparations made for that purpose, either by
7 hand or by means of mechanical appliances, singeing and
8 shampooing the hair, dyeing the hair, or permanently waving or
9 straightening the hair of any living or deceased person for
10 compensation, as performed by a Class 2 barber.

11 (3) BOARD. The Alabama Board of Cosmetology and
12 Barbering.

13 (4) CLASS 1 BARBER. A person who only does the
14 following in his or her ordinary course of business: Arranges,
15 cleans, cuts, or sings the hair of any person or massages,
16 cleans, stimulates, exercises, or does similar work on the
17 scalp, face, or neck of any person with the hands, or with
18 mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliance, or by the use
19 of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
20 creams. Any one or a combination of the following practices,
21 when done upon the human body above the seventh cervical
22 vertebra for cosmetic purposes and not for the treatment of
23 disease or physical or mental ailments, and when done for
24 payment, directly or indirectly or without payment for the
25 public generally: Shaving or trimming the beard or trimming
26 the hair.

1 (5) CLASS 2 BARBER. Any person, other than a student
2 or apprentice, who performs barbering on the general public
3 for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
4 licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a Class 2
5 barber. For the purposes of this chapter, the term barber,
6 standing alone, shall be deemed a reference to a Class 2
7 barber.

8 (6) COSMETOLOGIST. Any person, other than a student
9 or apprentice, who performs cosmetology on the general public
10 for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
11 licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a
12 cosmetologist.

13 (7) COSMETOLOGY. Any of the practices generally
14 recognized as beauty culture, hairdressing, or any other
15 designation engaged in by any person who performs such on the
16 general public for compensation including, but not limited to,
17 cleansing, singeing, cutting, arranging, dressing, curling,
18 braiding, waxing, bleaching, weaving, coloring the hair by
19 hand or mechanical apparatus, the use of creams, lotions, or
20 cosmetic preparations, with or without massage, on the scalp,
21 face, arms, legs, feet, or hands, esthetics practices, nail
22 technology, manicure, pedicure, or desairology.

23 (8) ESTHETICIAN. Any person, other than a student or
24 apprentice, who performs esthetics on the general public for
25 compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
26 licensure requirements provided in this chapter for an
27 esthetician.

1 (9) ESTHETICS. The practice of performing acts of
2 skin care including, but not limited to, facials, body waxing,
3 makeup, and general esthetics procedures on the general public
4 for compensation.

5 (10) ESTHETICS/MANICURE. A combination of the
6 practices of esthetics and manicure.

7 (11) ESTHETICIAN/MANICURIST. Any person, other than
8 a student or apprentice, who performs a combination of the
9 practices of esthetics and manicure on the general public for
10 compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
11 licensure requirements provided in this chapter for an
12 esthetician/manicurist.

13 (12) INSTRUCTOR. A licensee who teaches in a
14 licensed or registered school of barbering or any branch of
15 cosmetology and completes any applicable requirements for
16 continuing education.

17 (13) LICENSE. A document issued by the board which
18 entitles the holder to practice the profession listed on the
19 document.

20 (14) LICENSEE. Any person holding a license issued
21 pursuant to this chapter.

22 (15) MANICURE. The practice of beautifying or
23 grooming the fingernails, toenails, adding nail tips,
24 extensions, gels, or massaging the hands, forearms, feet, or
25 lower legs of the general public for compensation.

26 (16) MANICURIST. Any person, other than a student or
27 apprentice, who performs the practice of manicure on the

1 general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
2 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
3 chapter for a manicurist.

4 (17) MANICURE/WAXING. A combination of the practices
5 of manicure and waxing.

6 (18) MANICURIST/WAXER. Any person, other than a
7 student or apprentice, who performs a combination of the
8 practices of manicure and waxing on the general public for
9 compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
10 licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a
11 manicurist/waxer.

12 (19) NATURAL HAIR STYLING. The practice of
13 cleansing, weaving or interweaving, extending, locking,
14 braiding, or arranging the hair without cutting, coloring,
15 permanent waving, relaxing, removing, or chemical treatments.

16 (20) NATURAL HAIRSTYLIST. Any person, other than a
17 student, who performs natural hair styling on the general
18 public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
19 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
20 chapter for a natural hairstylist.

21 (21) SCHOOL. An establishment licensed or registered
22 by the board to teach any or all of the practices of barbering
23 or cosmetology.

24 (22) SHAMPOO ASSISTANT. Any person who is licensed
25 to perform only the practices of shampooing, cleansing, or
26 applying temporary weekly color rinses to the hair of the
27 general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the

1 qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
2 chapter for a shampoo assistant.

3 (23) SHOP. Any place where barbering or cosmetology
4 is practiced. Only a properly licensed person, who is not an
5 apprentice or a student, may operate a shop.

6 (24) STUDENT. Any person who is engaged in learning
7 any practice regulated by this chapter in a school licensed or
8 registered pursuant to this chapter, and who, as part of the
9 learning process, performs or assists in any practice
10 regulated by this chapter under the immediate supervision of
11 an instructor who is licensed pursuant to this chapter.

12 (25) THREADING. The practice of eyebrow removal with
13 the use of a loop made of cotton or any other material.

14 (26) THREADER. Any person engaged in the practice of
15 threading on the general public for compensation, and who
16 shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements
17 provided in this chapter for a threader.

19 "(a) No person may be admitted to an examination or
20 licensed as a natural hair stylist unless he or she satisfies
21 all of the following qualifications:

22 "(1) Is at least 16 years old.

23 "(2) Has successfully completed at least 10 grades
24 in secondary school, or the equivalent.

25 "~~(3) Has successfully completed at least 210 clock~~
26 ~~hours of natural hair style instruction in a school or an~~
27 ~~apprenticeship with a cosmetologist or a natural hair stylist~~

1 ~~licensed or registered under the provisions of this chapter.~~
2 Has successfully completed at least 210 clock hours in a
3 licensed or registered school of cosmetology or natural hair
4 styling or 420 clock hours in a licensed shop for a period of
5 six months under the immediate supervision of a licensed
6 cosmetologist or natural hair stylist, who has held a license
7 for at least five years, including practicing as a natural
8 hair stylist before August 1, 2013, and as a licensed
9 cosmetologist or a natural hair stylist before the effective
10 date of the act amending the subdivision. The five-year
11 requirement shall not apply to natural hair stylists operating
12 before August 1, 2013.

13 "(b) Any applicant who satisfies the qualifications
14 in subsection (a), pays any applicable examination fee,
15 successfully completes any examination, ~~unless the person is~~
16 ~~seeking licensure through an apprenticeship,~~ and pays the
17 license fee shall be issued a natural hair stylist license.

18 "(c) Any person who is working as a natural hair
19 stylist on August 1, 2013, upon payment of the applicable
20 license fee by January 28, 2014, shall be licensed by the
21 board under this section. Any person licensed pursuant to this
22 section shall be subject to this chapter and rules adopted by
23 the board pursuant to this chapter including, but not limited
24 to, shop requirements, sanitation procedures, and license
25 renewal."

1 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
2 first day of the third month following its passage and
3 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
