8	To amend Sections 37-7B-1 and 34-7B-20 of the Code
9	of Alabama 1975, relating to licensure of natural hair
10	stylists; to provide that a person may be licensed as a
11	natural hair stylist who has completed at least 420 clock
12	hours of natural hair style apprenticeship as a natural hair
13	stylist under a licensed or registered cosmetologist or a
14	natural hair stylist.
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
16	Section 1. Section Sections 37-7B-1 and 34-7B-20 of
17	the Code of Alabama 1975, $\frac{1}{100}$ are amended to read as follows:
18	"§34-7B-1.
19	For the purposes of this chapter, the following
20	terms shall have the following meanings:
21	(1) APPRENTICE. Any person engaged in learning the
22	practices defined in this chapter including, but not limited
23	to, assisting in the performance of any acts of barbering or
24	cosmetology on the general public under the constant and
25	direct supervision of a person who has held a valid current
26	license issued by the board for at least five years, in a shop

- (2) BARBERING. The occupation of shaving or trimming the beard, cutting or dressing the hair, giving facial or scalp massages, giving facial or scalp treatment with oils or creams or other preparations made for that purpose, either by hand or by means of mechanical appliances, singeing and shampooing the hair, dyeing the hair, or permanently waving or straightening the hair of any living or deceased person for compensation, as performed by a Class 2 barber.
- (3) BOARD. The Alabama Board of Cosmetology and Barbering.
- (4) CLASS 1 BARBER. A person who only does the following in his or her ordinary course of business: Arranges, cleans, cuts, or singes the hair of any person or massages, cleans, stimulates, exercises, or does similar work on the scalp, face, or neck of any person with the hands, or with mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliance, or by the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or creams. Any one or a combination of the following practices, when done upon the human body above the seventh cervical vertebra for cosmetic purposes and not for the treatment of disease or physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment, directly or indirectly or without payment for the public generally: Shaving or trimming the beard or trimming the hair.

(5) CLASS 2 BARBER. Any person, other than a student or apprentice, who performs barbering on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a Class 2 barber. For the purposes of this chapter, the term barber, standing alone, shall be deemed a reference to a Class 2 barber.

- (6) COSMETOLOGIST. Any person, other than a student or apprentice, who performs cosmetology on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a cosmetologist.
- (7) COSMETOLOGY. Any of the practices generally recognized as beauty culture, hairdressing, or any other designation engaged in by any person who performs such on the general public for compensation including, but not limited to, cleansing, singeing, cutting, arranging, dressing, curling, braiding, waxing, bleaching, weaving, coloring the hair by hand or mechanical apparatus, the use of creams, lotions, or cosmetic preparations, with or without massage, on the scalp, face, arms, legs, feet, or hands, esthetics practices, nail technology, manicure, pedicure, or desairology.
- (8) ESTHETICIAN. Any person, other than a student or apprentice, who performs esthetics on the general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this chapter for an esthetician.

1	(9) ESTHETICS. The practice of performing acts of
2	skin care including, but not limited to, facials, body waxing,
3	makeup, and general esthetics procedures on the general public
4	for compensation.
5	(10) ESTHETICS/MANICURE. A combination of the
6	practices of esthetics and manicure.
7	(11) ESTHETICIAN/MANICURIST. Any person, other than
8	a student or apprentice, who performs a combination of the
9	practices of esthetics and manicure on the general public for
10	compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
11	licensure requirements provided in this chapter for an
12	<pre>esthetician/manicurist.</pre>
13	(12) INSTRUCTOR. A licensee who teaches in a
14	licensed or registered school of barbering or any branch of
15	cosmetology and completes any applicable requirements for
16	<pre>continuing education.</pre>
17	(13) LICENSE. A document issued by the board which
18	entitles the holder to practice the profession listed on the
19	document.
20	(14) LICENSEE. Any person holding a license issued
21	pursuant to this chapter.
22	(15) MANICURE. The practice of beautifying or
23	grooming the fingernails, toenails, adding nail tips,
24	extensions, gels, or massaging the hands, forearms, feet, or
25	lower legs of the general public for compensation.
26	(16) MANICURIST. Any person, other than a student or
27	apprentice, who performs the practice of manicure on the

1	general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
2	qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
3	chapter for a manicurist.
4	(17) MANICURE/WAXING. A combination of the practices
5	of manicure and waxing.
6	(18) MANICURIST/WAXER. Any person, other than a
7	student or apprentice, who performs a combination of the
8	practices of manicure and waxing on the general public for
9	compensation, and who shall satisfy the qualifications and
10	licensure requirements provided in this chapter for a
11	<pre>manicurist/waxer.</pre>
12	(19) NATURAL HAIR STYLING. The practice of
13	cleansing, weaving or interweaving, extending, locking,
14	braiding, or arranging the hair without cutting, coloring,
15	permanent waving, relaxing, removing, or chemical treatments.
16	(20) NATURAL HAIRSTYLIST. Any person, other than a
17	student, who performs natural hair styling on the general
18	public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the
19	qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
20	chapter for a natural hairstylist.
21	(21) SCHOOL. An establishment licensed or registered
22	by the board to teach any or all of the practices of barbering
23	or cosmetology.
24	(22) SHAMPOO ASSISTANT. Any person who is licensed
25	to perform only the practices of shampooing, cleansing, or
26	applying temporary weekly color rinses to the hair of the
27	general public for compensation, and who shall satisfy the

1	qualifications and licensure requirements provided in this
2	chapter for a shampoo assistant.
3	(23) SHOP. Any place where barbering or cosmetology
4	is practiced. Only a properly licensed person, who is not an
5	apprentice or a student, may operate a shop.
6	(24) STUDENT. Any person who is engaged in learning
7	any practice regulated by this chapter in a school licensed or
8	registered pursuant to this chapter, and who, as part of the
9	learning process, performs or assists in any practice
10	regulated by this chapter under the immediate supervision of
11	an instructor who is licensed pursuant to this chapter.
12	(25) THREADING. The practice of eyebrow removal with
13	the use of a loop made of cotton or any other material.
14	(26) THREADER. Any person engaged in the practice of
15	threading on the general public for compensation, and who
16	shall satisfy the qualifications and licensure requirements
17	provided in this chapter for a threader.
18	"§34-7B-20.
19	"(a) No person may be admitted to an examination or
20	licensed as a natural hair stylist unless he or she satisfies
21	all of the following qualifications:
22	"(1) Is at least 16 years old.
23	"(2) Has successfully completed at least 10 grades
24	in secondary school, or the equivalent.
25	"(3) Has successfully completed at least 210 clock
26	hours of natural hair style instruction in a school or an
27	annrenticeshin with a cosmetologist or a natural hair stulist

licensed or registered under the provisions of this chapter. Has successfully completed at least 210 clock hours in a licensed or registered school of cosmetology or natural hair styling or 420 clock hours in a licensed shop for a period of six months under the immediate supervision of a licensed cosmetologist or natural hair stylist, who has held a license for at least five years, including practicing as a natural hair stylist before August 1, 2013, and as a licensed cosmetologist or a natural hair stylist before the effective date of the act amending the subdivision. The five-year requirement shall not apply to natural hair stylists operating before August 1, 2013.

"(b) Any applicant who satisfies the qualifications in subsection (a), pays any applicable examination fee, successfully completes any examination, unless the person is seeking licensure through an apprenticeship, and pays the license fee shall be issued a natural hair stylist license.

"(c) Any person who is working as a natural hair stylist on August 1, 2013, upon payment of the applicable license fee by January 28, 2014, shall be licensed by the board under this section. Any person licensed pursuant to this section shall be subject to this chapter and rules adopted by the board pursuant to this chapter including, but not limited to, shop requirements, sanitation procedures, and license renewal."

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the first day of the third month following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
