Section 1. In any county or municipality where the Sunday sale of alcoholic beverages is otherwise authorized by law, including the sale for on-premises consumption at a time after 10:00 a.m., the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday may be authorized for on-premises consumption commencing on Sunday at 10:00 a.m., and thereafter, by the county commission outside of the corporate limits of any municipality or the municipal governing body within the corporate limits of a municipality by ordinance or by resolution of the appropriate governing body.

Section 2. The provisions of this act are supplemental and shall not be construed to repeal any other law except to the extent of any conflict.

Section 3. This act shall become effective immediately following its passage and approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
