To amend Section 14-6-15 of the Code of Alabama 1 2 1975, relating to the commitment of prisoners in county jails; to require the sheriff to report to the clerk and the 3 presiding judge of the circuit court of the county that a 4 5 prisoner was committed to the county jail within a certain time frame; and to require the date and time the prisoner 6 7 entered the jail be included in the report, along with other 8 information.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

10 Section 1. Section 14-6-15 of the Code of Alabama 11 1975, is amended to read as follows:

"§14-6-15.

13 "When a prisoner is committed to the county jail, it 14 is the duty of the sheriff of such the county, in person or by 15 deputy, to report in writing or by electronic communication to the clerk and the presiding judge of the circuit court of such 16 17 the county, within 10 days next succeeding no later than 9:00 18 A.M. on the day following the commitment, the name of such the 19 prisoner, the day date and time of his or her entering such 20 the jail, and by what authority and upon what charge 21 committed; and when a prisoner is discharged from, or 22 otherwise leaves such the jail, the sheriff shall report to 23 such the clerk, within two days next succeeding, the name of 24 such the prisoner and by what authority and when he or she so left or was discharged." 25

Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
