27	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

- Section 1. The Legislature finds and declares the following:
- 3 (1) The preservation of human life is of the highest value in this state.
  - (2) It is of utmost importance that law enforcement agencies implement policies and practices to prohibit the use of unnecessary lethal force by law enforcement officers.
  - (3) Law enforcement officers should be trained and required to use a proportionate response to a threat of harm that is reasonable under the particular circumstances.

Section 2. (a) (1) A law enforcement officer may use only the force that is reasonably necessary, including the preferred use of tasers or chemical irritant aerosols, to effect lawful objectives including any of the following:

a. A lawful arrest.

- b. Overcoming resistance to a lawful arrest.
- c. Preventing the escape of an offender.
- d. Protecting or defending others or themselves from physical harm.
  - (2) A law enforcement officer may not use lethal force, except for the defense of himself or herself or another from serious physical injury or death.
  - (b) The Alabama Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission shall adopt policies consistent with this section.
  - (c) For the purposes of this section, "law enforcement officer" means an officer with the power of arrest

who is employed with any state agency, department, board,
commission, or institution or any municipality or county
within this state and is certified by the Alabama Peace

Officers' Standards and Training Commission.

Section 3. This act shall become effective on the
first day of the third month following its passage and
approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
