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8 SYNOPSIS: This bill would provide for the Alabama
9 State Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA) to create a
10 statewide database of persons who have been issued
11 a pistol permit. This bill would authorize the use
12 of the database by law enforcement officers during
13 traffic stops. This bill would require the sheriff
14 of each county to provide information regarding the
15 pistol permits issued to ALEA.

18 TO BE ENTITLED
19 AN ACT
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21 To provide for the Alabama State Law Enforcement
22 Agency to create a statewide database of persons who have a
23 pistol permit for use by law enforcement officers when making
24 a traffic stop; to require the sheriff of each county to
25 provide certain information to ALEA regarding pistol permits
26 issued by that sheriff; to authorize any state, county,
27 municipal, or university law enforcement agency to use the

1 database; and to authorize ALEA to promulgate rules necessary
2 to effectuate the compilation of information and creation of
3 the database.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:

5 Section 1. (a) The Alabama State Law Enforcement
6 Agency (ALEA) shall create a statewide database of residents
7 who have been issued a pistol permit.

8 (b) The sheriff of each county of the state shall
9 provide to ALEA information regarding each pistol permit
10 issued by it. ALEA shall specify the format in which and the
11 frequency with which the information shall be submitted.

12 (c) After the effective date of this act, the
13 sheriff of the county shall require any person seeking a
14 pistol permit to provide his or her driver's license number if
15 he or she is a licensed driver. The database shall reference
16 the driver's license number of each licensed driver who is
17 issued a pistol permit.

18 (d) Any state, county, municipal, or university law
19 enforcement agency may utilize the database upon its creation.

20 (e) ALEA may promulgate rules necessary to provide
21 for the compilation of information and creation of the
22 database.

23 Section 2. This act shall become effective on the
24 first day of the third month following its passage and
25 approval by the Governor, or its otherwise becoming law.
